## Nebo Elementary Goals

Nebo Elementary will increase student achievement as measured by the 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade Georgia Milestones ELA and Math Assessment System. The students will increase their proficient and distinguished scores 3% in ELA and 6% in Math Achievement Data.

- ✓ In 5<sup>th</sup> grade our school will focus on developing reading comprehension.
- ✓ In 5<sup>th</sup> grade our school will focus on developing multiplication fact fluency.

## Paulding County School District Goals

- During the 2018- 2019 School Year, PCSD will increase the percent of students scoring proficient in Math and Science by 3% on Georgia Milestones.
- During the 2018- 2019 School Year, PCSD will increase the following subgroups: SWD, EL, ED to proficiency in ELA by 3%.
- During the 2018- 2019 School Year, PCSD will increase the percent of students scoring proficient or distinguished in ELA and Social Studies by 3% on the Ga Milestones.

# Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

## *In the Fifth Grade Classroom*

The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade team will work with students and their families in partnership for student success in Reading and Math. We will work with families to support students in the following ways:

- ✓ Provide parents with multiplication/division flashcards with suggested activities throughout the year for students to work on nightly along with any other needs based differentiated activity based on data.
- ✓ Provide parents with texts from ReadWorks or Reading A-Z in a reading bag with comprehension questions for parents to ask their child nightly before, during, and after reading a text.
- ✓ Encourage parents to visit the Parent Resource Center and to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.
- ✓ Emails, SeeSaw, Class Dojo and/or Remind Me texts will be sent weekly to keep parents informed about homework, assessments, and upcoming school events.

## *Nebo Elementary Students*

Nebo students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and help row in the right direction towards success in Reading and Math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ✓ Practice multiplication fact fluency using my flashcards for 5 minutes each night.
- ✓ Using the books provided, I will read to an adult for 20 minutes each night and answer the comprehension questions they ask. I will prove my answers with support from the text.
- ✓ Encourage my parents to visit the Parent Resource Center to check out games and materials to support learning at home. Remind them about monthly parent meetings and family learning nights, and schedule meetings throughout the year with the teacher and/or the Title I ILT to understand curriculum and learn concepts when needed.
- ✓ Share my homework tasks with my family each night.

## *At Home*

Nebo School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in Reading and Math:

- ✓ Help my child practice multiplication flashcards for 5 minutes each night.
- ✓ Ask my child comprehension questions after he/she has read for 20 minutes.
- ✓ Visit the Parent Resource Center and try to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights. I know I can also access meeting resources online.
- ✓ Check email to ensure my child is on target and I will support my child with their homework.
