Language Arts/Reading

In 6th grade, Language Arts builds on skills previously learned and introduces many new concepts to the students. Grammar skills are reviewed and worked on daily through warmups. The elements of literature, such as plot, figurative language, and conflict, are taught in class and then focused on through short stories, novels, and poetry. The integration of writing is also a daily practice for the students. All of our teachers enhance their classrooms using technology and try to incorporate as much as we can to reach each student and their learning style.

Math

Throughout the course of the school year, students will encounter various math concepts.

1st 9 weeks- Number Fluency/Proportions 2nd 9 Weeks- Algebra

3rd 9 weeks- Geometry/Statistics

4th 9 weeks- Rational Numbers
Mathematics instruction is taught using a
variety of resources. A textbook or workbook
can be issued upon request. Selected students
are enrolled in Accelerated Math. In this

course, students are taught the entire 6th grade curriculum and the first semester of the 7th grade curriculum.

Science

In 6th grade, students will focus on Earth science. Topics will include the study of meteorology, geology, astronomy, hydrology, the use of natural resources, and human impact on the earth. Students will use the scientific method to perform many experiments and investigations. Students will refer to an Interactive Earth Science book when completing lab activities. Teachers use class notes, handouts, and graphic organizers as study tools.

Social Studies

In sixth grade social studies, the first nine weeks period is usually the most challenging. During this time we delve into specific forms of government and economic systems found in the world. This offers many new terms and schools of thought. Continuous review of these terms at school and home is a plus. Once students have an understanding of the information covered in the first few weeks of school, we begin our study of the following regions: Europe, Canada, Latin America and Australia. For each area studied, we learn about the history, exploration of, government, culture, environmental concerns and specific locations on a map. Students will have a culminating project each nine weeks.

Extended Learning Time (ELT)

Extended Learning Time is during 3rd period. During this time, teachers can specifically address targeted skills or provide enrichment activities. Identified students who have been placed in tier 2 or 3 are placed in small groups. This allows students to review, practice, and maintain skills already taught. It also gives the students a chance to see concepts presented in a different way. Students are regrouped every nine weeks based on their performance in school. Advanced students will be provided enrichment classes with an emphasis on project/media based instruction and AR.

Connection Classes

Sixth grade students will be able to participate in P.E., Health, Art, Drama, Chorus, Computer, and Language Arts Enrichment.

Any rising 6th grade student may register for

band. Band is a year-long course.

Nine Weeks Exams

At the end of each nine weeks students will be given a nine weeks exam in each content area. Students will be given a study guide to help adequately prepare for the exam. Nine weeks exam constitute 10%-15% of the final average. The exam and answer sheet will not be returned to the student.

Homework

Students will have homework most nights.
There will always be math to review,
vocabulary terms to study, maps to review &
science notes to study. Students will be given
advance notice before tests/quizzes in order to
study. Homework assignments will be written
by the student in their agenda.

Discipline Policy

Student discipline will follow the guidelines of the Creekside Plan and Code of Conduct that includes a positive behavior intervention system called Character Chief Program.

Comprehensive Guidance Program

The transition to 6th grade brings anticipation, new opportunities and challenges. The Counselor's role is to help students to understand themselves, accept themselves, and to help them to make decisions that affect their lives. Students will have opportunities to explore college and career options. Counselors also work with parents and guardians to keep them aware of and involved in their student's planning. Counseling is delivered through Classroom Guidance, Short-term Individual **Counseling Responsive Services, and System** Support. The counselor is your point person for setting up meetings, accessing resources, and providing support with academic (SST/504) and social/emotional issues.

All 6th grade students must have proof of immunization for the 2nd dose of Varicella on Georgia Form #3231. The immunization can be obtained at the local Health Department or your family physician.
