Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) & Florida State Standards



Florida Standards require students to interact with complex text, respond to text based questions at a higher level, and write about what they are reading. The math standards require a deeper understanding of the standards.

Middle School Requirements

Students must pass the following to be promoted to high school:

- 3 years of language arts
- 3 years of social studies (one must be Civics course)
- 3 years of math
- 3 years of science



Students who fail any class for the year must recover the course through APEX or be retained in 8th grade.



Students are arranged on interdisciplinary teams

- All 6th grade students take <u>Research</u>* (a reading-based class) & <u>Health</u>* (1 Semester Each)
- Math Yr. Long
- Science Yr. Long
- US History Yr. Long
- Language Arts Yr. Long
- Elective (Either Yr. Long or 2 Semester Courses)



Elective Options:

6th grade students will be asked to rank order their electives from 1 (Most) -5 (Least). The course selections are the following:

Band - Mr. Cook (year long class)

Music – Mr. Brockman(year long class)

Chorus- Mr. Brockman(year long class)

Guitar – Mr. Brockman (year long class)

Creative Writing – Mrs. Harsch (year long class)

Art- Mrs. Wilson (semester)

Theatre-Mr. Roush (semester)

Physical Education -Coach Bain and Coach Flatley (semester)

Advanced Course Work:

- Advanced Course Criteria: Placement in advanced courses will be based on grades in previous classes, standardized test scores, and teacher recommendations.
- Advanced Course Options include the following:
 - Language Arts, Advanced
 - 6th Grade Math, Advanced
 - Science, Accelerated Honors
 - U.S. History, Advanced
- Center for Gifted Studies



Acceleration Options

High achieving students interested in taking accelerated courses with the opportunity to complete high school level math and science courses while in middle school may elect to participate in courses offered at CSRMS. Students will have the opportunity to earn 3 or more high school level credits as CSRMS students.

Intensive Courses:

- The determination of placement for intensive reading will be determined after receiving the scores from the standardized testing and academic performance.

Homework

Can be expected on a regular basis from all classes.

Students are expected to read nightly a minimum of 20-minutes

Often, students will be assigned 20-minutes of homework per subject

This may include projects or long term assignments and also reviewing and studying for quizzes and tests.

Students know of up coming assessments, usually a week in advance

Even if no homework is assigned, all students should review concepts taught in the day's lesson (e.g., re-read, review notes, visit online sources, etc.)

Students are responsible for writing homework in a planner. My Student only tells your child's progress not the assignments for the evening.



Open communication, patience, and understanding will go a long way




*Students may become more independent and will fight the notion of parents interfering in their lives.
