

Content:

Classroom instruction will be guided by the Common Core Georgia Performance Standards (CCGPS) as established by the Department of Education. Advanced seventh grade math consist of nine units. Three units are from the seventh grade standards and the rest of the units are from the eighth grade standards. You may obtain a detailed copy of the standards at the Georgia Department of Education website at www.gadoe.org.

First Semester:

- Unit 1 Inference (2 weeks) *7th Grade*
- Unit 2 Geometry (7 weeks) *7th & 8th Grade*
- Unit 3 Probability (2 weeks) *7th Grade*
- Unit 4 Exponents (3 weeks) *8th Grade*
- Unit 5 Functions (2 weeks) *8th Grade*

Second Semester:

- Unit 6 Linear Functions (3 weeks) *8th Grade*
- Unit 7 Linear Models (4 weeks) *8th Grade*
- Unit 8 Solving Systems of Equations (4 weeks) *8th Grade*
- Unit 9 Geometric Applications of Exponents (4 weeks) *8th Grade*

(Please note this pacing schedule is a guide and may change as needed.)

Homework:

Students will receive homework on a daily basis and on weekends, even if it is just to study. You are encouraged to make friends and study groups for discussing homework. The most obvious presumed benefit of homework is, of course, that it will improve students' understanding and retention of the material covered.

Assessments	85% (class work, projects, culminating tasks, reflections, summative and formative assessments, diagnostic assessments)
Final Exam	15% (semester exams)
