# **Course Description:**

Seventh grade is the second year of a two year World Area Studies course. Seventh grade students study Africa and Asia. The goal of this two year course is to acquaint middle school students with the world in which they live. The geography domain includes both physical and human geography. The intent of the geography domain is for students to begin to grasp the importance geography plays in their everyday lives. The government/civics domain focuses on selected types of governments found in the various areas in order to help students begin to understand the variety of governments in the world. The economics domain builds on the K-5 economics; however, the focus shifts from the United States to how other countries answer the basic questions of economics. The history domain focuses primarily on significant events in each region from the twentieth and twenty-first centuries.

# **Outline of Course**

These regions of the world will be taught during the year:

- Southwest Asia (Middle East) -1st 9 weeks
- Southern and Eastern Asia— 2<sup>nd</sup> 9 weeks
- Africa 3<sup>rd</sup> 9 weeks
- GA Milestone prep and preview 8<sup>th</sup> grade Georgia History

In relation to each region, these five domains will be taught:

• Geography, Economics, History, Government, and Culture

The Georgia Performance Standards for Social Studies were designed to develop informed Georgia citizens who understand the history of the United States and our place in an ever increasing interconnected world. It is essential that students understand their past and how that past influences the present day and the future. This year Georgia has added Literacy standards in History/Social Studies as part of the Common Core Curriculum. These standards require students to be able to read and comprehend history/social studies texts in the grades 6-8 text complexity band independently and proficiently. The writing standards require students to write routinely over extended time frames and shorter time frames for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences.
