Also called Optical Art; uses geometric designs to create a feeling of movement

- (1) by repeating the same element such as a shape or a figure;
- (2) by repeating two or more elements on an alternating basis (ABABABAB)
- (3) by progression
- 3. What was Op Art's primary goal?
 primary goal was to fool the eye

 - 5. Which elements are chosen carefully to achieve a certain effect? **Colors and perspective**

Technique where artists use lines and geometry to create the illusion of distance on a flat plane

2. What is the HORIZON LINE?


Line where the earth and sky meet


3. What is the VANISHING POINT?
