





TIERED DIPLOMA:

- Diploma with HIGHEST DISTINCTION (32 credits)
 - Passed all courses throughout their high school career
 - · Receive a diploma seal and cord
- Diploma with DISTINCTION (28 credits)
 - Passed all academic and pathway courses and 8 elective courses
 - Receive a diploma seal
- STANDARD Diploma (24 credits)
 - Passed all academic and pathway courses and 4 elective courses
 - This student has been involved in in the SST/RTI/IEP process
 - This is a small percentage of students with the primary goal of getting back on the 28 credit track.

PATHWAYS

Area of Interest "Students take classes tailored to their [pathway], which helps them navigate their way to greater success – no matter what they choose to do after high school graduation. The aim of the program is to show students the relevance of what they're learning in the classroom, whether they want to attend a two-year college, a four-year university or go straight into the world of work. 
Winder Barrow Cluster Elective Options for 2018-19



WHAT?

- 1.0 credit is earned by passing each course you take
- 6 credits to attain
 10th grade status
- 24 (correct) credits to graduate



HOW?

- A grade of 70 is passing and results in gaining a credit
- So the goal is to pass with a 70?



- Grades count!
- Colleges will see freshmen classes
- Any student that does not pass a course will have to retake the course through Foothills for \$150



REGISTRATION TIMELINE

- Jan 16 Teachers begin making course recommendations
- Jan 16 -BCMS 8th grade students tour WBHS
- Jan 18 RMS 8th grade students tour WBHS
- Jan 29, 3:30-6:00 PM Honors/AP Night & Pathway Night at WBHS
- Feb 19, 4:00-6:00 PM Course Reveal Night at WBHS
- Feb 22 LAST day to turn in course recommendation forms to middle school



REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Teachers will make academic course recommendations
 - Talk to teachers if you have questions
- Teachers will help students select (1) PE or JROTC, (2) three electives, and (3) five elective alternates
 - Talk to your students about electives and encourage them to pick ones that are of INTEREST TO THEM, not their friends
 - It is very likely they will get an alternate choice

MAKE YOUR DECISIONS

*Changes to your student's course requests - both academic and electives - can be made via the Course Recommendation Change Form distributed at Course Reveal Night. The LAST DAY to turn in forms is February 22.

Schedules changes after February 22 are rare and treated on an individual basis.

Please remember, students will take 16 electives in high school. Not all will be in a pathway or will be top choices.



COLLEGE READINESS

- Freshman year grades count
- Consider taking rigorous courses
 - Shows colleges you are challenging yourself
 - Play to your strengths
- Take the PSAT 8/9 in October
 - Optional; small fee (~\$15)
 - Administered at WBHS during school day





DUAL ENROLLMENT



- Allows high school students to earn college credit while enrolled in high school
- Open to 9th-12th graders
- Covers tuition and books (may not cover certain fees, supplies, or equipment)
- Part-time or full-time
- Must meet admissions criteria set by college
- College-level expectations


