Course Description:

Students will be exposed to, and will respond to, a wide variety of media including, but not limited to,

novels, short stories, poetry, essays, newspaper articles, broadcast news reports, video clips and plays.

Supplies for face to face learning:

Course Texts:


The literature textbook that will be utilized as a resource is <u>Elements of Literature</u>: <u>Second Course</u> by Holt, Rinehart, and Winston. READ180 students will utilize the READ180 rBook in conjunction with the READ180 LBook as literature and grammar resources. A textbook will not be assigned to students to take home. Textbooks will be used in class only. Students may be issued a grammar workbook for homework purposes.

Novels that will be read this year:

- 1) The Westing Game by Ellen Raskin
- 2) Chasing Lincoln's Killer by James Swanson
- 3) 3rd and 4th nine week novels will be announced at a later time

- Read and comprehend literary nonfiction proficiently.

- Use knowledge of language and its conventions when writing, speaking, reading, or listening.
- Acquire and use accurately gradeappropriate general academic and domain-specific words and phrases; gather vocabulary knowledge when considering a word or phrase important to comprehension or expression.
