Attendance

- "Several high quality research studies show that the impact of chronic absence leads to lower achievement, disengagement and often dropout." Satisfactory attendance should be set at 95% or better.

- Students are expected to arrive to class on time following the Bell Schedule previously covered. More than 3 unexcused tardies may result in disciplinary action.
- The first and last 15 minutes of class are especially important because this is when teachers introduce new material, review assignments requirements and due dates.

Make-Up Work Policy

Excused Absence

- Students/Parents should provide documentation for any absence upon the students' return to school. These documents should be submitted to Mrs. Williams in the front office in order for an absence to be marked "Excused"
- Students have **three days** to make-up work that was assigned on a day that they are absent with a **valid excuse**.
- Students should submit work that is due on a day that they miss with a valid excuse as soon as they "return" to class. Failure to do so may result in a late penalty.

Unexcused Absence

• It is at the **teacher's discretion** to accept or refuse work that was not turned in as a result of an unexcused absence.

Late Work Policy

- Timely Submissions
 - The importance of TIMELY and CONSISTENT practice.
 - Unexcused late submissions will receive a 30 point deduction.
- 3 Day Window
 - Work that is more than 3 days late may not be accepted. The teacher will examine the situation and determine the best course of action.
