Courses are offered in Chinese (CHI 1120 and CHI 1121), French (FRE 1120 and FRE 1121), French Conversation (FRE 2210 or FRE 2211), Spanish (SPN 1120 and SPN 112: Spanish Conversation (SPN 2210 or SPN 2211), German (GER 1120 and GER 1121), La (LAT 1120 and LAT 1121) and Brazilian Portuguese (POR 1120 and POR 1121) that ful this eight credit hour requirement.
