- Learn skills in class, see them in action on field trips, utilize them in on-the-job internships









What To Consider When Applying

 St. Johns County students can apply to Programs of Choice/Career Academies at any school in the district

 However, students cannot apply for a Program of Choice/Career Academy at an out of zone school if a duplicate Academy is offered at the student's zoned school

 Duplicate programs to Nease's offerings include IB and ROTC.

What To Consider When Applying

- Schools that offer IB/AICE: St. Augustine & Pedro Menendez
- Schools that offer ROTC: St. Augustine & Bartram Trail
- If you are zoned for a school that offers IB/AICE or ROTC, but are interested in our program in addition to a unique Nease Academy/Program of Choice, you must apply to an Academy that is unique to Nease, THEN:
 - Contact Missy Kennedy if you're interested in the IB Program
 - Contact Jaime Combs if you're interested in ROTC

What To Consider When Applying

 St. Johns County does not provide transportation to students attending out of zone schools

Academy Application Window Open Now Through February 8th

- For application information, go to: academies.stjohns.k12.fl.us
- Log in to HAC to apply by using your <u>student's</u> username and password
- Apply for up to three Career Academies/Programs of Choice, but you must select a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice
- IB and AICE Programs require teacher recommendations
- Step by step directions to apply via HAC are located on neaseacademies.com

Academy Applications

• Private school students who live in St. Johns County must make a pre-registration appointment at the student's zoned school (middle school for 8th graders, high school for 9th graders) to prove residency before they'll be able to apply (via paper application)

Academy Applications

- Academy application window closes on February 8th at 5 p.m.
- After the window closes, all applicants to
 Academies and ROTC programs will be entered
 into a computer lottery to fill the available
 number of open spaces in each program.
- You will receive acceptance notification via email at the end of February, so be sure that the email address contact information in your student's HAC email is an address you check frequently.
