



International Baccalaureate Programme (ibo.org/diploma/index.cfm)

Students apply for entry to the Pre-IB/IB Programme. This is a four-year comprehensive continuum of courses challenging student to study at the college level throughout their high school career. The pathway across the years is predetermined with a general elective option in 10th grade and an IB elective option in 11th grade. Students commit to all four years, taking Pre-IB Honors and AP courses in grades 9 and 10, and AP and IB courses in grades 11 and 12. Students earn a course grade through their years' work and take an AP or IB exam in May that many colleges and universities accept for credit towards an undergraduate degree. Students earn the IB Diploma or IB Certificate, internationally recognized academic credentials accepted by universities worldwide.



Advanced Placement Courses from the CollegeBoard (apcentral.collegeboard.com)

Students request enrollment in particular AP courses that are areas of strength or special interest. Typically, students who go on to AP courses in grades 10, 11 and 12 have seen success in Honors courses during the earlier years (grades 9 and 10). Students who wish to challenge themselves at the college level in the 9th grade year find great success in AP Human Geography, while the course remains open to students in



10th grade and above. Most students take AP courses during their day at LOLHS, though some opt for online options with Pasco eSchool or FLVS. Students earn a course grade through their year's work and take an AP exam in May that many colleges and universities accept for credit towards an undergraduate degree. Each year, over fifty LOLHS students are recognized as AP Scholars.

Dual Enrollment Courses in Partnership with Pasco-Hernando Community College (phcc.edu/explore-programs/dual-enrollment)

Students wishing to start on the road to earning college credits can take PHCC courses through Land O' Lakes High School. Courses are offered on the LOLHS campus, PHCC campus, or with PHCC online. Students who see success in Dual Enrollment courses have taken Traditional and Honors classes in their earlier years of high school (grades 9 and 10, and up through 11), and are ready to pursue classes that will count towards an Associate Degree or other certificates from Pasco-Hernando Community College. Students must have met high school testing requirements and demonstrate appropriate levels of college readiness based upon the PERT or equivalent measures. HONORS Courses at Land O' Lakes High School (lolhs.pasco.k12.fl.us/?page_id=2454)

Offered throughout the years of study, Honors courses drive students to higher levels of critical thinking and expression. While Traditional classes guide students to demonstrate their abilities with the standards-based curriculum, Honors courses help students develop critical thinking through more rigorous reading and writing. Strong performance in Honors courses is a good indicator of future success in AP and DE classes.

Students and parents must select classes wisely. By choosing courses during registration, students commit to meet high expectations for attendance, effort, participation, and cooperation. Students will meet course requirements for the full year.
