#### **District Goals**

The percentage of students reading on grade level as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment by the end of 3rd grade will increase to 100% (baseline 75.3%) by 2023.

The system percentage of students scoring at the developing, proficient, and distinguished levels on the:

- ELA portions of the GMAS will increase to 85% (baseline 70.3%) by 2023.

- Math portions of the GMAS will increase to 89% (baseline 78.9%) by 2022. - Science portions of the GMAS will increase to 82% (baseline 69.9%) by 2023. - Social Studies portions of the GMAS will



increase to 85% (baseline 74.6%) by 2023.

## **READING ACHIEVEMENT**

## ATTENDANCE GOAL

- Teachers will increase the percentage of days present to 96% each month. Benchmark is 93.2% average.
- Students will increase the percentage of days present to 96%. Benchmark is 95.276%.
