For this reason, this simulation immerses students into financial life as an adult, so they can go through the actions of paying bills, saving for, retirement and dealing with unexpected events. Students will be given a Schedule of Events. The Schedule of Events is a chronological list of bills, quizzes, surveys, and paychecks are meant to give teachers a heads-up on what is happening in the simulation. Once the simulation begins, students will be immersed into the financial life of a college graduate. They will begin to receive and pay bills, maintain their CFS, and monitor and manage their credit card balance. To avoid paying bills late, students will need to stay engaged, plan and execute a budget. Students will learn through the process of researching and answering quiz questions, using provided resources, and through interacting with customer service through the Help Desk.
