

Hi Parents and Students!

We've had some crazy weather and I know that it can take a toll on our bodies…even teachers were sick! Kids, please listen to your parents and take care of yourself! Remember to wash your hands, cover your mouth if you cough or nose if you sneeze, and eat your fruits and veggies! On an important note, I'd like to talk a bit about bullying because it is important to understand that not everything is bullying. Sometimes, what is happening is that the behavior is actually rude or mean, and there is a difference.

Rude = <u>Accidentally</u> saying or doing something that hurts feelings or embarrasses someone. EX: sneezing or coughing on someone, burping in someone's face.

Mean = Saying or doing something on purpose maybe once or twice. EX: slapping something out of another person's hand, laughing at someone who fell down.

Bullying = <u>Repeatedly</u> saying or doing something on purpose <u>and</u> one person has more power than another person. EX: stealing someone's snack everyday, telling someone to not play with another person or you won't be their friend.
