What is the AICE Program at BHS?

The Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (Cambridge AICE) is a group certificate which requires learners to study subjects drawn from three curriculum areas within Cambridge International AS & A Level: mathematics and science, languages, and arts and humanities, over the course of three years. For students seeking the AICE Diploma, there is also a compulsory core subject, Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research, in addition to a community service/paid work requirement of 100 hours.

While we are excited to offer this program as the newest AICE school in St. Johns County Schools, Cambridge International AS & A Level qualifications have been taken by over 175,000 learners in nearly 130 countries every year.




Who are we?

Students who complete the AICE Diploma must complete a minimum of 14 AICE credits (7 courses and examinations) as identified by the Cambridge Assessment International Education (Cambridge International) in the Diploma Core and three (3) academic areas/groups over three (3) years:

AICE Diploma Core—AICE Global Perspectives & Research AS level

Group 1—Mathematics and Sciences (Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Management, Marine Science, Mathematics, Physical Education, Psychology)

Group 2—Languages (English Language, English Language and Literature, French, Portuguese, Spanish)

Group 3—Arts and Humanities (Art & Design, Business, Digital Media, Drama, English Literature, International History, US History, Media Studies, Psychology, Sociology, Travel & Tourism)

Group 4—Interdisciplinary (General Paper, Thinking Skills)
