Course Description: Algebra 2 is the third course in the Math sequence of the Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE). Students in Algebra 2 have completed and mastered topics covered in Geometry and Algebra 1. This course is rigorous preparation for Pre-calculus. Successful students are those willing to accept the challenge of such a course.

Textbook: HMH – Intro to Algebra 2 (This is accessible on your chromebook in your launch pad)

Classroom Expectations: It is the expectation that students will log in to Google Meet using their Henry County issued Chromebook with their assigned Henry County login for every class meeting. It is required that students use their assigned Henry County Chromebook for all tests and quizzes. If you do not have a school issued Chromebook or your Chromebook is broken and unusable please contact me immediately.

- BE ON TIME give yourself ample time to turn on computer, log in and join the meeting.
- BE PREPARED gather your pencil, paper, and calculator before class begins.
- BE INVOLVED participate in class discussions and try all practice problems.
- BE RESPECTFUL turn off your microphone and turn on your camera.
- BE READY A moderator may be called upon to help with the google meet chat feature and letting me know when questions arise during presentation time.

Participation & Completion Grade: In addition to regular graded classwork and quizzes, students will receive a 100 classwork grade at the beginning of each week. Ten points will be deducted for each missed practice assignment or unexcused absence that week. Your participation and work habits are an easy way to guarantee at least one perfect score each week.

ASSIGNMENTS: Each student is expected to attempt, complete, and check every assignment. A mixture of task related, written assignments, and online assignments will be used to help students master the content. Mathematics is learned by practice; therefore, complete your work when it is assigned. It is permissible to discuss problems with other students or relatives BUT not permissible to copy another person's work. Students should keep their assignments neatly organized in their notebooks with work shown.

Attendance

Attendance is extremely important. When a student is legitimately absent, that student has the same number of days to make up an assignment or test (absent 3 days = 3 days to make up work). The STUDENT is responsible to arrange the make-up of tests or quizzes. Classes will be recorded and posted on Google Classroom.
