Instruction by Highly Qualified Teachers

"Parents Right-to-Know"

 Parents have the right to be informed regarding qualifications of their child's teacher and paraprofessional. Parents will be notified if a teacher is not highly qualified and is in their child's classroom for more than 20 consecutive days.
 Parents may request credentials.

What is "Highly Qualified" for teachers?

- Teachers must be certified by the GA Professional Standards Commission in the areas in which they teach
- Teachers must hold at least a bachelor's degree and demonstrate competency in subjects taught.
 - Substitute teachers must also hold a Bachelor's degree.




What is "Highly Qualified" for paraprofessionals?

- Paraprofessionals must have completed at least 2 years of college or study at an institution of higher education
- Obtained an associate's degree or passed a state assessment.




