

***Anthem* by Ayn Rand: Ch. 1-6 Conflict Storyboard**

Without conflict, the story would drag and fail to hold the reader's attention.***

- You will need to fold your papers to create four columns. Then fold it in half to divide those columns in half. Then trace the lines to create the chart that is at the bottom of this page.
- **At the top of each box**, write the chapter number(s), whether the main conflict is internal or external, and the type of conflict. Write a complete, well-written sentence that summarizes the **most important conflict** that occurs in each chapter(s). Place this information in the boxes as shown in the sample drawing below.

- ✓ Your sentences must be complete, well-written and accurately explain the conflict occurring in the chapter(s).
- ✓ You will be graded on the accuracy of illustrations (**10 points per box**), and the accuracy and quality of the required information in the top of each box (**10 points per box**).
- ✓ You will also be graded on overall neatness, creativity, accuracy of information, and effort (**10 points**), and clear evidence that you read and understood the story (**10 points**).
- ✓ **Write your name and class period on the back of your paper.**

WARNING: If your storyboard is in any way identical to another student's storyboard, you will both receive a zero for plagiarism. Please do your *own* work and do not work with another student.
