Advanced Placement Updates from College Board

In order to support students in continuing their AP journey, College Board is offering optional free, online AP classes and take-at-home AP Exams.

- AP Testing will not be done in schools this May. AP exam registrants will be offered the opportunity to test from home on-line with 45 minute exams, taking only free response questions, and no multiple choice questions.
- AP Exams will focus on the first 75% of the yearly curriculum, or what students were most likely already taught before school stopped.
- Students may elect to take the at-home exam or cancel the exam and receive a full refund.
- College Board will offer free AP Review sessions on line beginning Wednesday March 25th, and run at various times for the different courses. - Special stipulations for certain exams:

AP Studio Art: All submissions will be digital (pictures) with no physical artwork being mailed. Deadline for a reduced digital submission requirement will be May 26th.

Computer Science Principles: The exam will be entirely project-based digital submission with NO written exam. Digital submission deadline extended to May 26th.
