


#### Theatre at NPHS

#### Band at NPHS

Spring has been an incredibly productive and busy time for the NPHS Band Program. The Wind Symphony traveled to the University of Alabama on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and played an outstanding concert at their Honor Band Festival. Mike Bearden, Director of Bands at North Paulding, was awarded a Citation of Excellence from the

National Band Association for the performance.

Later in February, several students attended the District Honor Band event in Ringgold, GA, as well as one student being placed in the All-State Band held in March. On March 15 and 16, the North Paulding Band Program attended Large Group Performance Evaluation and enjoyed great success in taking all four concert ensembles to perform for adjudicators at Rome High School. They are one of very few programs in the state to be represented by four ensembles that attended the event.

March also marks the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Paulding County Honor Band, which brings in students from all five high schools and nine middle schools together to perform concerts under the direction of excellent clinicians. The event was help on March 23 and 24 and hosted at NPHS.










Student Talent Show at PCHS - February 7

The Georgia Governor's Honors Program (GHP) is a residential summer program for gifted and talented high school students who will be rising juniors and seniors during the program. GHP is held in mid-summer as a residential educational experience on a college or university campus. Students attend classes in the mornings and afternoons in specific areas of study, and they participate in a wide variety of social and instructional opportunities every evening. The 2017 session will be held at Berry College in Rome, Georgia.

Once students are nominated by a teacher or counselor, they go through a rigorous selection process at the school, district, and state levels.

#### Art at PCHS

The Paulding County Visual Arts Program has partnered with The Memory Project which is a nonprofit organization that invited Mrs. Thomas and her students to create portraits for youth around the world who have faced substantial challenges, such as neglect, abuse, loss of parents, and extreme poverty.

The portraits help the children feel valued and important, to know that many people care about their well-being, and to act as meaningful pieces of personal history in the future. For our art students, this is an opportunity to creatively practice kindness and global awareness.

To do this, The Memory Project receive photos of children and teens from global charities operating residential homes, schools, and care centers in a number of different countries every year.

Then they provide us with fullpage color prints as well as digital copies of those photos, along with plastic sleeves to protect the finished portraits. Mrs. Thomas then works with her students to create the portraits, and the Memory Project hand-delivers them to the kids (we have several different art students create portraits for each child based on several different poses).

This is the fourth year Mrs. Thomas's Drawing and Painting classes and Art Club have participated through a generous grant from the Memory Project founder its Shumaker. Mrs. Thomas not only

this project uses opportunity to teach students the value of outreach and giving back as global citizens, but also as a rich Art History lesson where make students must portraits in the style of a famous artist and create a powerpoint presentation on their artist and how it relates to their Memory Project portrait.


