
Each Student who reads FIVE Sunshine State books and passes the AR tests will be invited to the Sunshine State book celebration in May.


SPARK LAB DONATIONS

GROWTH MINDSET

Creating a Growth Mindset Environment

It's tough to talk to our, "older" kids about growth mindset. You know, our fourth, or fifth graders or middle school age kids. It's NOT like they will come running into the family room after we announce, "Let's talk about mindset and how you can grow from mistakes."

But we could surround our children with an environment that reflects a growth mindset. We could fill the family rooms with books about mindset. Let these books guide some conversations. What if The Little Engine couldn't? How would this story be different? Then discuss the story as it happened...why didn't The Little Engine give up? Did it have a growth mindset? This could work for our younger children, but let's keep in mind our intermediate and middle school aged children. How could the environment help them open up about growth mindset moments?

One way could be to fill the refrigerator with papers or pictures that show your child trying their best; giving effort; showing growth or improvement (not just A papers). Have some games around the family room that stretch thinking. Have some books that show resiliency in the face of setbacks. Nonfiction sports books about famous athletes are an excellent way for our children to see growth famous people have experienced. I recently read about our "MINI PAWs" being saved until the end of each quarter and used to recognize growth, effort and behavior. What a fun way to let your children be accountable for their hard work and how it pays off.

Some comments that you might hear on a daily basis in this environment could include:

"You don't quite understand yet."

"Great effort!"

"I noticed so much effort and improvement."

"You have really grown in that area."

Some things that we may do as parents:

appreciate process more than outcomes value work ethic

stay calm and growth mindset oriented when our children bring home a less than stellar grade

set age appropriate goals with your children

design changes and learn about forces and friction and how they interact with each other.


This month, we will also be busy making a sustainable bridge. We'll look at the fundamental principles of bridge engineering.

GRADE LEVEL NEWS

KINDERGARTEN

March started with immense excitement as we celebrated Dr. Seuss's birthday and books! Our kindergarten classes enjoyed decorated hallways generously created by our dividends! Students made and ate green eggs, created a Fox puppet, invented their own truffula tree, and learned many interesting historical Dr. Seuss facts. With all the rhyme reading and history lessons, kindergarten is now practicing 60 sight words or more; and in math, they are adding and subtracting facts. Furthermore, to top off all of the educational fun, we ended our third guarter with amazing games and activities for field day followed by our family picnic. During the month of April, we have our field trip to the Central Florida Zoo, and we begin our preparations for the Kindergarten Musical, One Big Happy Family, which will be on May 2 in our Little Theater. Hope to see you there!

1ST GRADE

Fantastic First Grade

The first grade students had fun at the Panther Pride Picnic and Field Day! During this last quarter of the school year, the students will be getting ready for second grade! In language arts, the students will be learning how to write an opinion piece with reasons to support their opinion. They will also explore the similarities and differences between two texts on the same topic. Living and nonliving things will be the focus in science. In math, the students will be learning about the attributes of various 2-d and 3-d shapes. Please keep reading and practicing those sight words at home to increase reading fluency.

2ND GRADE

Second grade is hopping into spring! We hope everyone had a relaxing spring break and ready for the final quarter of school. In math, we are working on money and time. You can help reinforce both these skills at home. Your child can help count your change and tell you what time it is. Please continue to look over your child's work, planner, and homework. Thanks for all your support!

3RD GRADE

Spring is in the air in 3rd grade! We have been exploring plans and their parts as well as classifying plants and animals. We will conclude this unit of study with a project on our favorite animal, so look

for directions to come home from your child's teacher later this month. In Math. we will continue to calculate the area and perimeter and then conclude our year with Geometry. We are learning a lot of new math vocabulary between

now and the end of the year. You can help your child by pointing out different shapes you see in the world around you and asking for the name of the shape. For example, what shape is that stop sign? How many right angles do you see in that street sign? In Reading we have been reviewing all the concepts we have learned so far this year. On April 9th and 10th all third graders will take the Reading FSA. This is a paper and pencil test where students will be asked to read various fiction and nonfiction texts and answer auestions based on those stories. It is natural for students to be a little nervous as the test approaches. Extra hugs and words of encouragement go a long way! Third grade teachers encourage a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast on test days. Our third graders are ready to show what they know!

4TH GRADE

In Reading we are preparing to rock out our FSA Reading during the second week of April. We are also continuing to work on comparing and contrasting two different texts and will be moving into teaching theme with fables and folktales. In grammar students will be working on ordering adjectives and prepositions and prepositional phrases. Lastly, we will be focusing on Poetry since April is National Poetry Month. In Math, we are working with fractions, Mixed Numbers, and decimals. Students are using manipulatives and number lines to solidify their understanding of these types of numbers. In Science, we are working on weathering and erosion. Students are learning how to identify the differences between these two processes.

5TH GRADE

Fifth graders have an action-packed end of the year ahead! We are continuing to practice skills in all areas, and are prepping for the upcoming FSA assessments. Please check the testing calendar and schedule for when your child will participate in these assessments. More detailed information from classroom teachers will also come home. Thank you to all parents who have sent in their child's Kennedy Space Center field trip form and money. All student and chaperone money is due on April 13th. After this, we will send home updated

> information about the mud walk at the Environmental Studies Center, which will take place on May 7th. Also, for JHMS students, please mark your calendars that the students will visit the school and have a tour on May 15th. Thank you
