

During Spring Break parents, students and community volunteers came to IPES for "Campus Beautification Day!" Our IPES Campus was given some much needed TLC.





IPES is doing great things in science and engineering with the help of Mrs. Agunat, STEM Resource Teacher. Her passion for STEM is evident in the work she has done in collaboration with the IPES classroom teachers to implement Project Lead the Way (PLTW), the newly adopted science program at IPES.

Through the Campbell/Kapolei Complex Area DoDEA (Department of Defense Education Activity) grant IPES has been able to purchase iPads and PLTW kits for grades K through 5. Along with this, Mrs. Silao, our Technology Coordinator and teacher, has provided students opportunities to learn how to code using ozobots. Coding builds both creativity and coding skills in ages 6 and up.

For the first time IPES hosted "Family STEM Night". Students and adults alike had hands-on approach to science...from building with VEX kits, computer programming, rocketry and more. The hands-on approach made learning fun for the entire family. Hats off to our Military Partners who helped our students with some of the stations.
