Virtual Learning Expectations

Documentation

- If a scholar is removed from the Google Meet, parent contact will be made by the teacher
- If a scholar receives a Jag Bite, documentation will come home for a signature as well as a phone call or e-mail.
- If a scholar receives an office referral, a parent or guardian will be contacted by an administrator.

Make-Up Work

- a. Scholars are responsible for any missed assignments on the first day they return to school from an absence. The number of days allowed to complete make-up work will be commensurate with the number of days in which the scholar was absent. Failure to comply with this procedure will result in a grade of zero (0) being given for graded assignments missed during an absence
- b. Scholars assigned out of school suspensions (OSS) will be allowed to make-up work upon return to school. The number of days to complete the assignments is commensurate to the number of days of OSS (i.e., 3 days of OSS = 3 days to makeup missing assignments).

Late Work Policy

Assignments that are not submitted on time will receive an "M" (missing) within the Infinite Campus grade book. Late work that is submitted will receive a ten (10) point deduction from the overall grade for each day past the original due date

for the scholar. Once the teacher has placed an assignment in the grade book, students will have only one week to complete the assignment with the 10 point deduction taken for each day late. When missing work is completed and submitted for grading the teacher will then replace the "M" in Infinite Campus with the earned grade. Any assignment not submitted will remain as a permanent grade of zero (0%) within the Infinite Campus grade book.
