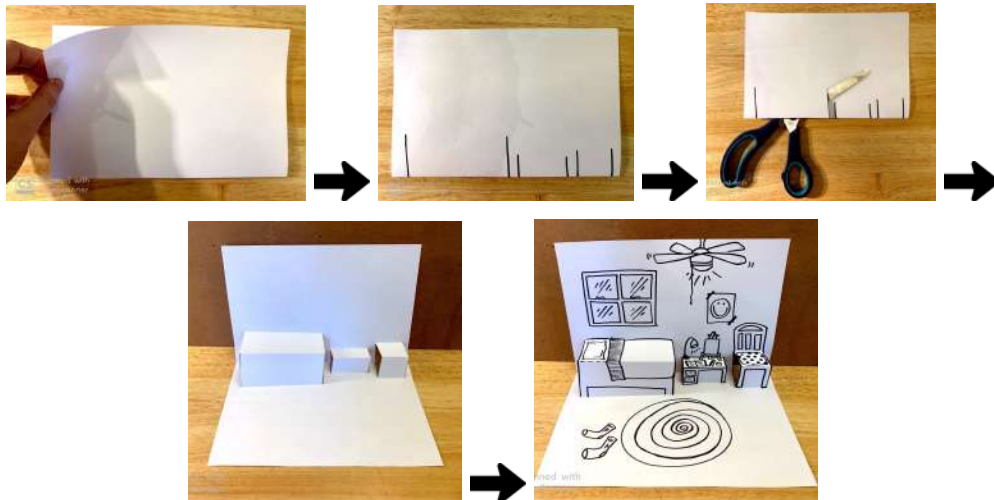


# ART BEYOND THE ART ROOM! WEEK 4

Hi 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students! This week, we'll be exploring **three-dimensional** art. **Choose one or more** of the challenges below, and create your artwork with any art materials you have. 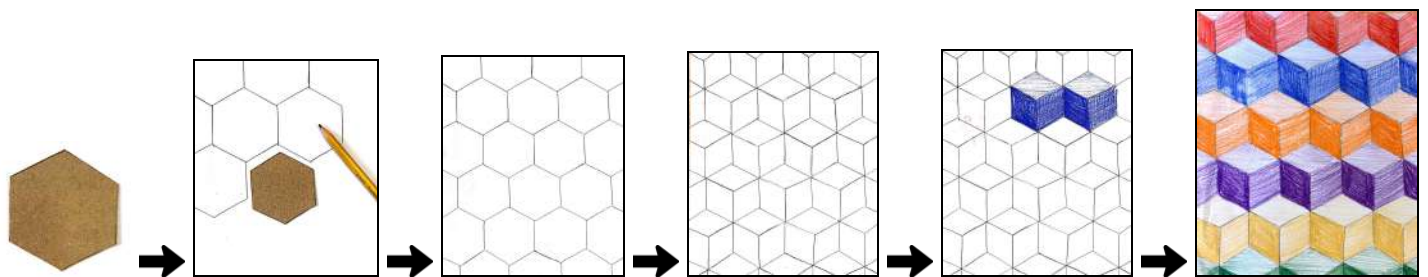
## Challenge 1: Pop-Up Room

**Fold** your paper in half. **Draw** 2-3 pairs of **parallel lines** on the edge of the fold. **Cut** on the lines. Open up your paper and **pop** out the squares. **Draw** details of your room—real or imaginary.



## Challenge 2: 3D Cube Optical Illusion

**Cut** out a hexagon from a piece of cardboard. Make sure all the sides are the same length! **Trace** hexagons on a blank piece of paper. Turn the hexagons into **cubes**. **Shade** the cubes using three **values**: dark, medium, light.



## Challenge 3: Make Your Own Clay Sculpture

Playdough (never hardens or dries)

### Ingredients



2 cups flour



1 cup salt



1 cup cold water



1 tablespoon oil

### Steps

1. Mix the ingredients together to form clay.
2. Store clay in a sealed container when you're not using it.

Salt Dough (bake in an oven to harden)

### Ingredients



4 cups flour



1 cup salt



1 1/2 cups water

### Steps

1. Mix the ingredients together to form clay.
2. Store clay in a sealed container until you're ready to sculpt with it.
3. Bake your sculpture at 250 degrees Fahrenheit for about 1 hour. Let it cool before you touch it.

*Neither clay will last forever. If it looks moldy or smelly, it's time to throw it away!*
