**Description of Studies:** 

Art is a nine-week connections program that involves the process of creating, connecting,

presenting and responding to art based upon the Georgia Standards of Excellence for Visual Arts. With freedom to choose materials and subject matter, students engage in personalized learning and discover new strengths along the way. Students learn about art and creativity, explore with materials and techniques, understand the functions and foundations, and make meaningful connections through art. When students focus on the Studio Habits of Mind and the FCS Learner Profile, we develop the whole artist. Students will understand that art is a journey and that it takes practice and persistence to succeed.

Activities used in class:

Opening	Students are required to enter class and work on the opening assignment in their art journals or			
assignments	as directed. Opening assignments will include vocabulary, artists, sketches, writing, researching,			
	thumbnails, techniques development, etc.			
Art Portfolio	Students will create a portfolio in class to keep their work and evaluate their artistic progress.			
	They can also keep a digital portfolio through the Seesaw Learning App which allows them to			
	take pictures, videos, give feedback and share their work.			
Practicing	Students are expected to practice their art techniques inside and outside of class. Students will			
techniques	explore with different art materials in class and create a rough draft of their artwork before			
	moving on to their final product.			
Material	Students will develop their skills and techniques. They will utilize their materials properly and			
Exploration	also be responsible for cleanup. Proper material care will allow for broader choice in materials			
	such as: drawing pencils, colored pencils, watercolor, india ink, soft pastels, oil pastels, collage,			
	acrylic paint, wire, mixed media, clay, photography, etc.			
Research	Students will research using various methods about specific topics relating to art such as famous			
	artists, styles, movements, tutorials, cultural connections.			
Studio Time	Students will utilize their time wisely to create works of art during Studio time and focus on			
	Studio Habits of Mind: Develop Craft, Engage and Persist, Envision, Express, Observe, Stretch			
	and Explore, Understand the Art World and Reflect.			
Creating Final	Students will create final works of art that are presentable, fit the criteria and standards, show			
Artwork	craftsmanship and will be used as a summative grade.			
Critiquing /	Students will collaborate to: describe, analyze, interpret, and evaluate their work of art as well as			
Presenting	the work of others in a considerate manner.			
Rubrics	Students will use rubrics on summative assignments to reflect upon their artwork and assess			
	their own work.			
BYOT	Bring your own technology is encouraged to use for research, lessons, engagement in activities,			
	visual reference, and to keep a digital portfolio of art work and progress.

Rather than giving a grade of zero for work that has not been completed, students will be assigned morning detention to complete the missing assignments. If the assignments have still not been completed, the student will receive an Administrative Referral and will be assigned to ISS for a final opportunity to complete outstanding work. Not doing the work is not an option at SFMS!
- The Media Center will be open every day at 8:00 am in order to provide students with the opportunity to utilize the school facilities—including computers with Internet access—to complete school work. Students who choose to use the Media Center will follow normal rules and will work independently to preserve a quiet and focused learning environment.
