MOT Charter School

Performance Agreement Objectives

MOT Charter School has successfully met and exceeded its performance targets year after year.

I. During the term of this Agreement, the school shall attain the classification of "commendable" or "superior" as set forth by the requirements for public schools in the regulations adopted pursuant to Del. C., Title 14, Section 154.

MOT Charter School was rated a "Superior" school in 2010-2011, and met all state AYP targets to achieve a "Superior" status in 2011-2012.

II. DSTP and NWEA

A. Student Achievement Target ONE: On the DSTP, average performance on each subject at each grade level will be at or above the state average.

In the two years since our last renewal, the average performance of MOT Charter students has consistently exceeded the state average at each grade level in each subject—in many cases substantially so. The only instance where the mean score achieved by MOT Charter students has not exceeded the state's average was in third grade reading in the Spring 2012. However, in that same year 88% of MOT Charter students met or exceeded the state standard versus 75% achieved statewide.

MOT Charter ranks in the top 10 of schools statewide in math, reading, science and social studies at the middle school level.

B. Student Achievement Target TWO: On the NWEA, average annual student growth in Math, Reading and Language Usage at each grade level will be at or above the national mean growth.

In 2010-2011 and in2011-2012, the average growth of MOT Charter school students met or exceeded the national mean growth for reading at all grade levels with the exception of 2^{nd} grade in the spring 2012. Students met or exceeded the national mean growth in math at all grade levels in 2011 and in kindergarten and grades 4-8 in 2012. Summaries of the fall-to-spring growth for each year are attached to this application.

III. During the term of this Agreement, the school will demonstrate that its students exhibit positive behavior related to academic success through the following:

A. For each year of the school operation, average daily attendance will be at least 90% of the average daily enrollment.
