Actions to create a Supportive Learning Environment for accelerated or academically struggling students

- Innovative Learning Coach, Instructional Coach, and Magnet Coordinator will collaborate with teachers to support students who struggle with innovative learning approaches.
- Feedback and targeted support will be provided by school staff and external partners on their GaSTC projects.
- Targeted lessons and conversations with students about small group and collaboration norms.

Actions to create a Supportive Learning Environment for accelerated or academically struggling students

- Academic Interventionist
 - Specifically focused on helping students in 8th-11th grade core courses
 - Constant monitoring of failing students
 - Saturday Extended Learning program, along with after-hours tutoring opportunities
- Co-teaching, collaborative, and consultative services will be provided to students with IEPs
- MTSS program/supports

Professional Capacity building to support the above goal and action steps

- Professional learning will be provided to all instructional staff on how to establish, use, and assess learning targets.
- Training will be provided to SPED and general education co-teachers on effective co-teaching strategies. This will include following up with observations and specific feedback.
- Learner Profile will be shared with staff and continually reinforced in meetings and other collaboration opportunities.
- Instructional Coach will work with 8th grade ELA and Math teachers on Units of Study and Open Up implementation.

We are looking forward to engaging our families next school year, particularly after such a challenging year last year. We will have Open House and Class Orientations in July 2021.

We will regularly utilize our website, social media, Remind, and an email newsletter to keep our community abreast of new information. We will also have monthly Parent Chats to empower parents (and other guardians) with important information they need to help guide their children through high school, college, and career success.

We are proud to have two student representatives and two parent representatives on our School Governance Team. These groups provide input and direction to our work. Additionally, we work with a variety of community partners in mutually beneficial relationships. For example, this past year Walton EMC funded the implementation of 7 Mindsets curriculum for all of our students because they recognized the need for these mindsets in their future workforce.





Effective Leadership: Describe the school plan for:

Each team member is on a "Staff Crew." This is a small group of team members who meet on a monthly basis to build connection and make space for social-emotional learning. This year, these groups will study the book *Onward*. Students are also on student crews for the same purpose. They will continue learning the 7 Mindsets for success.

Our leadership team will meet on a monthly basis to learn, inform, and drive strategy. Department teams will meet weekly to calibrate, share information, and conduct instructional rounds. Department leaders will conduct instructional rounds inside and outside their department with administration.

The TKES process will be implemented to collect evidence on teacher effectiveness.

Administration will find and leverage resources to support instruction. We will build on last year's success with receiving over \$16,000 in grants to pursue a variety of grants; we will also utilize the support of the district's grant writer for support.

Our leadership team developed the School Improvement Plan in the summer of 2021. This will drive the Team Action Plans and individual Professional Learning Goals developed by each team/individual at our school. These plans and goals will be monitored on a regular basis, including through observations, instructional rounds, and check-in meetings. They will also be the subject of team members' mid-year and summative conferences.

Effective School Transitions: Describe strategies to facilitate effective transitions for students from preschool to early elementary grades, elementary to middle grades, middle grades to high school, and high school to post secondary education.

Students will be onboarded to BASA in 8th grade. We will host a variety of parent and student meetings in order to orient these new families to our school. All 8th grade students will take the YouScience Snapshot assessment and subsequently complete a Four-Year Graduation Plan for high school. They will also visit high school classrooms and labs in order to learn more about the opportunities available to them.

It is our hope that every student will take college-level coursework prior to graduation, including academic dual enrollment, career-technical dual enrollment, and/or AP courses. We believe this provides the ultimate preparation for their future success. Through Sims Academy, we will continue ensuring that these opportunities are available to students and that they know about them. We are beginning a small Work-based Learning Program this school year so students can gain authentic experience in the workforce. All 10th grade students will take the YouScience assessment and debrief on their future opportunities. All 10th graders will take the PSAT to help inform their strategies for college prep.
