Attendance Zone Changes

- •On April 26, 2022, the School Board approved an advertisement for the proposed Attendance Zone Changes for the 2022-2023 School Year. Although, the official approval will not occur until May 31st, it is unlikely that a change will be made at this point, as it would require the District to take several steps back in the process. Florida Statute requires that a proposed Attendance Zone change be advertised for 30 days before a School Board can act.
- •Since we are so close to the end of the school year and to make the transition as smooth as possible for families, the District has asked Principals of the receiving schools to begin communication with the families included in the advertisement.



Communication With Teachers

- ▶ We welcome your communication. Email communication is the preferred method. Due to the busy nature of the school day our teachers will need time to respond. Please allow up to 48 hours.
- Schoology Messages is a way for students to communicate with their teachers in grades 3-8.
- ▶ To request a meeting with an individual teacher via email for an appointment. Many middle school teachers generally like to meet as a team when there is a parent conference. This helps with getting a better understanding of what is going on with the student in all his/her classes.
- Being an informed parent will allow you the opportunity to support your child throughout their school experience.

Elementary Folders, Planners, Schoology, and HAC

- Organization is key to success! A communication folder for grades K-2, planners for grades 3rd - 8th are provided to each student at the start of school year and is an excellent tool to remind your child of upcoming assignments and due dates.
- ▶ Students in grades 3rd 8th should record all homework, assignments and assessments in their planner each day.
- Schoology is where 3rd − 8th grade teachers post the learning activities and power point presentations students get in the classroom. This is an excellent resource to use when studying for a test and keeping organized.
- ► Home Access Center (HAC) is where K-8 parents can see interim reports and report cards. In grade 3rd – 8th, parents and students can see the grades for each assignment or assessment for all their classes. This should be checked on a weekly basis.

Backpacks

- Backpacks may be carried between classes for middle school students – please stress the importance of load capacity with your child and utilizing their lockers. Elementary students are provided a cubby to place their backpacks and lunch boxes.
- No rolling backpacks are allowed without a doctor's note – these cause a trip hazard during hall change


Cell Phones and Smart Watches

- ► Must be OFF and kept in backpack for K-5 and in their locker for grades 6-8.
- Students may not use the cell phone during the day.
- ▶ A phone will be taken if it is out during the day.
 - ▶ First Violation: Phone confiscated; corrective consultation & phone returned at end of day by the Dean
 - ▶ 2nd Violation: Parent must meet with Dean for a conference
 - Subsequent Violations: Progressive Discipline Followed



SJCSD Dress Code Policy

- Personal attire may be in the style of the day. Clothing, piercings, and accessories displaying profanity, violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive phrases, phrases or symbols of alcohol, tobacco or drugs is unacceptable.
- Gang graffiti will not be drawn or worn on backpacks, notebooks, folders, papers, clothing or any other object or on the body of any student or person on school property.
- Pajamas shall not be worn as exterior clothing on campus.
- ► Head gear, including but not limited to, caps, hats, bandanas and/or sunglasses shall not be worn indoors on campus unless permitted by school administration for religious or medical reasons. Students may wear sunglasses, hats, or other sun-protective wear while outdoors during school hours.
- ► Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to the mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps and be long enough to adequately cover the waistline and not expose the midriff.
