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Reading

Oral Reading Fluency & Comprehension

As a school, we will...

- Provide parents with oral reading fluency and comprehension strategies to use when reading with their child.
- Provide library or classroom books and reading fluency passages for reading practice at home.
- Provide reading logs to monitor reading practice.

As a parent, I will...

- Use strategies provided by the teacher to help my child improve oral reading fluency and comprehension.
- Listen to my child read daily using books or passages provided.
- Sign the reading log after listening to my child read.

As a student, I will...

- Share the strategies with my parent(s) or family.
- Practice oral reading fluency and comprehension strategies when reading books or passages each day.
- Read aloud daily to a parent or other family member.

2019-2020 District Goals

The Pierce County School System will:

- increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in English Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.
- increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in Math on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.

2019-2020 BES Goals

Reading: In 2nd grade, BES will increase the number of students scoring in "Core Support" on the DIBELS Daily Oral Reading Fluency from 60% in Spring 2019 to 65% in Spring 2020.



The end of year reading target scores are :

- Oral reading fluency of 90+ words per minute and
- Lexile comprehension score (SRI) of 530+.

Math: In second grade, BES will increase the number of students scoring in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" on STAR Math from 39% in Spring 2019 to 44% in Spring 2020.



The end of year math target is a score of 595+ on the STAR Math Assessment.

Addition and Subtraction Fact Fluency

As a school, we will...

- Provide Bear Basics fact fluency for student practice twice weekly at home.
- Send home math fact fluency strategies for parents to use when working with their child at home.

As a parent, I will...

- Practice Bear Basics fact fluency with my child weekly.
- Use strategies provided by the teacher to learn ways to help my child improve math fact fluency.

As a student, I will...

- Study with Bear Basics twice weekly at home to improve my math facts.
- Share strategies with my parent(s) or family and utilize strategies to help improve addition and subtraction fact fluency.
