Increase Reading Comprehension

2018-2019 District Goals

The Pierce County School System will

- increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in English Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.
- increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in Math on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.

2018-2019 BES Goals

Reading: In third grade, BES will increase the number of students scoring in "Proficient or Advanced" on the Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) from 75% in Spring 2018 to 77% in Spring 2019.



The end of year reading target scores are:

- Oral reading fluency of 110+ words per minute and
- Lexile comprehension score (SRI) of 670+.

Math: In third grade, BES will increase the number of students scoring in the "Proficient" or "Advanced" range on STAR Math from 59% in Spring 2018 to 61% in Spring 2019.



The end of year math target is a score of 700+ on the STAR Math Assessment.
