2018-2019 BES Goals

<u>**Reading:**</u> In first grade, BES will increase the percentage of students scoring in "Core Support" on the DIBELS Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) from 46% in Spring 2018 to 48% in Spring 2019.



The end of year reading target is <u>60+ words per</u> <u>minute</u>.

<u>Math:</u> In first grade, BES will increase the percentage of students scoring in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" range on STAR Math from 48% in Spring 2018 to 50% in Spring 2019.
