Monica Malseed is the Art teacher at Reach Academy for Girls. She was elected as a faculty representative to the Reach Academy for Girls Board of Directors in 2014. She also teaches a course in the Continuing Adult Programs and Services Division of Neumann University.

In conjunction with the Middle States Association of Schools and Colleges, Mrs. Malseed has chaired teams evaluating schools seeking accreditation. She also chaired the steering committee for St. Maximilian Kolbe's accreditation self-study process.
