ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.

Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.5 (4.0 scale). (Students with an advanced degree from a regionally accredited university are excused from this requirement.)

Evaluation of content coursework for admission into K-12, 5-8 or 9-12

DISTRICT REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A mentor teacher for the teacher candidate with a minimum of one hour per week of time to meet and collaborate.
- 2. Enrollment of the candidate in an existing new teacher mentor program (if available).
- 3. One full release day per week for each teacher candidate to complete coursework.
- 4. Two formal evaluations (one each semester) and four informal observations (teaching episode) for the school year.
