Course Description: AP Statistics is a rigorous, college level non-calculus based course intended to be the equivalent of an introductory college level statistics course. The AP syllabus and College Board guide the course.

Course Outline and Content:

This course covers the following topics in Statistics:

- Exploring Data and Modeling Distributions
- Describing Relationships
- Designing Studies
- Probability and Random Variables

- Sampling Distributions
- Confidence Intervals
- Testing a Claim
- Statistical Inference

Classroom Rules and Discipline Procedures: All students must adhere to the rules and expectations outlined in the Henry County Schools student handbook and the Union Grove High School student handbook addendum. Additional Class Information:

Hall Pass Policy: Students are required to utilize and display the standard issued UGHS pass at all times while out of the classroom, failure to do so will result in disciplinary consequences. Students are also required to fill out the Google form prior to leaving the classroom and document their return time on the same form. Teachers will not give out hall passes during the first ten minutes or last ten minutes of class. It is the teacher's discretion to allow or deny a hall pass request.

Chromebook Policy: It is an expectation for students to have their charged Chromebook with them every day. Failure to do so will be regarded as "not being prepared for class."

On Time Policy: In order to be considered "on time" to class, the student must be across the threshold of the classroom or designated classroom area by the end of the tardy bell.

Make-up Policy: Attendance is extremely important. You miss valuable class discussions that help you master topics being covered when you are absent. The time during which makeup work must be <u>completed</u> should not exceed the number of days missed by the student. Makeup work for this student is eligible for maximum credit for correct work. **It is the responsibility of the student** to make arrangements <u>on the first day back</u> from an absence for making up missed assessments and secure all notes from classmates or from Google Classroom. <u>Class time will not be spent completing make up work</u>.

Grading System: Credit is given per SEMESTER (1/2 credit each) based on the following categories:

Content will be presented by concepts (learning targets) within the chapters as indicated in the textbook. Through the checks for understanding, outside practice (Homework), and FRQ's, students will prepare and enforce the concepts. Completing these tasks will help improve the student's learning of the essential learning targets and their results on the graded assessments.

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy: The cell phone/electronic device policy begins when students enter the designated classroom area. All students will place all cell phones/devices in the teacher assigned caddy. During this time, cell phones must be turned off. Additionally, all smart watches or other electronic devices connected to the phone must be caddied until the end of class. Cell phones/devices will remain caddied until the end of class. Students will NOT be allowed to take their phones/devices out of the room when they have a hall pass to the restroom, media center, etc. Students will be allowed to use cell phones/devices before first period, during lunch, and during class transition. Bluetooth Headphones are not allowed unless the teacher has specified the use for an assignment.

Unit Repair Plan: As it is the goal of the mathematics department, our AP mathematics program and Union Grove High school to provide students rigorous, appropriate coursework that will result in college ready students. Opportunities for unit repair have been structured in a framework that reduces the opportunities yearly throughout the mathematics sequence, thus at the AP level there are no unit repair opportunities.

Exam Exemption: To encourage and reward excellent attendance, each student may earn the right to exempt one (1) spring semester non-state required final exam. Each student must meet clear guidelines to qualify for this exemption. Please see our school website for all requirements and guidelines.
