# Box It!

- 1. TOP: Paper-cover or paint the top of the box, being sure to leave the slit and tab operational. Students need to be able to open the box! On the top of the tab write the Publisher, Copyright Date and the total number of pages.
- 2. FRONT: Draw an illustration to cover one large surface of the cereal box. Be sure to draw the shape of your cereal somewhere too! Include on this section the name of the book,


