## **∇** Course Philosophy

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a 4-year college preparatory elective program that prepares students for entrance into college upon graduation. The program emphasizes specific skills required for college entrance and college success, i.e., analytical writing, SAT/ACT Prep (free), test taking strategies, note-taking, and research skills. Through their Academic Coach/Teacher, students receive one-on-one guidance from the start of high school through college acceptance! (This program counts towards 4 of the 8 required Elective Credits needed for graduation.)

## **∇** Course Description & Structure

Each year, students build upon a foundational structure that provides support for academic success!

- In the Student Strategies for Success Level I, AVID students focus on discovering their interests and thinking about colleges and careers that fit into those interests. Foundational skills include time management, note taking, textbook reading/writing techniques, using a planner/calendar system, and maintaining the AVID binder.
- Through the *Preparing for College Curriculum Level II*, AVID students begin practicing for the SAT/ACT while exploring careers and business entrepreneurship. Foundational skills include the importance of "writing as a tool for learning."
- During the College and Career Readiness Levels III & IV, (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> Grades) AVID students receive formal SAT/ACT Test Prep (free); and also research/apply for scholarships and college/university entrance. Students apply for scholarships and college admissions in the classroom with direct, hands-on assistance.

### $\nabla$ Who qualifies for AVID?

- Students who are serious about their academic success
- Students who have a minimum 2.0 grade point average (G.P.A.)
- Students who have appropriate classroom behavior and good attendance
- Students who have the motivation/desire to prepare for acceptance into a four-year college or university
- Students who are willing to commit to enrollment in rigorous college preparatory courses
