CAREER ACADEMY SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

PROGRAM DETAILS

An Academy is a program of study offered at our community high schools designed in a specialized career area. An import- ant aspect of the Career Academy programs is to offer summer internships that relate to their Career Academy focus to interested students after their junior year of high school.

- Offered to current high school juniors
- Students must apply for an internship experience, complete Career Skills training, prepare a resume and be interviewed and selected by the prospective business partner
- Internship schedule can be tailored to fit your business needs
- Ideally students will intern 20 hours a week for 6 weeks
- Businesses can host an unpaid internship or may offer students a paid position

HOST INTERN RESPONSIBILITIES

BEFORE INTERNSHIP

- Complete the Business Partner Intern Intent Form
- Interview the student applicants and choose your intern
- Schedule a time for the student to come to your business before the end of May to see your site

DURING INTERNSHIP

- Develop the summer work experience tasks for the student, provide training and then monitor their work performance
- Submit short student timesheets at the end of each week

AFTER INTERNSHIP

- Review the student's PowerPoint before they submit it to be sure the information is accurate and does not share confidential information
- Complete a survey at the end of the internship to help us improve the program in future years
