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

Section 14.1 Career Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) For <u>ALL</u> Students









State Legislation

BRIDGE bill mandates that 8th grade students select/create a Program of Study/Individual Graduation Plan for grades 9 through graduation.

(c) Beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, students in the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades shall be provided counseling, advisement, career awareness, career interest inventories, and information to assist them in evaluating their academic skills and career interests.



BRIDGE and Advisement

- Before the end of the second semester of the eighth grade, students shall develop an individual graduation plan in consultation with their parents, guardians, or individuals appointed by the parents or guardians to serve as their designee.
- High school students shall be provided guidance, advisement, and counseling annually that will enable them to successfully complete their individual graduation plans, preparing them for a seamless transition to postsecondary study, further training, or employment.



Individual Graduation Plan

- 1) Includes rigorous academic core subjects and focused course work in mathematics and science or in humanities, fine arts, and foreign language or sequenced career pathway course work
- 2) Incorporates provisions of a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP), where applicable
- 3) Aligns educational and broad career goals with a student's course of study
- Is based on the student's selected academic and career focus area as approved by the student's parent or guardian



Individual Graduation Plan

- Includes experience-based, career-oriented learning experiences, which may include internships, apprenticeships, mentoring, co-op education, and service learning
- 6) Includes **opportunities for postsecondary studies** through articulation, dual enrollment, and joint enrollment
- 7) Is flexible to allow for change in the course of study, but is sufficiently structured to meet graduation requirements and qualifies the student for admission to postsecondary education
- Is approved by the student and the student's parent or guardian with guidance from the student's school counselor or teacher adviser



BRIDGE Implications for LEAs:

- Mandates 6-12 system of advisement for ALL students through a systematic, comprehensive and developmental advisement process
- Mandates 6-8 educational and career planning to result in an individual graduation plan synonymous with the Peach State Pathway Program of Study prior to the end of the second semester of the 8th grade
- Mandates continued annual advisement 9-12


Marketing Sales & Services

 Is a coherent, articulated sequence of rigorous <u>academic and career/technical courses</u>, usually beginning in the 9th grade and leading to a diploma, associate degree, <u>baccalaureate</u> <u>degree and beyond</u>.






