A. Resolutions/Recognitions (no-action items)

1. Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga High School's 2018 STAR Student, Alex Huskey and STAR Teacher, Kathy Floyd.

To obtain the STAR nomination, high school seniors must have the highest score on any single test date of the SAT taken through the November test date of their senior year and be in the top 10% or top 10 students of their class, based on grade point average. Once chosen, each high school STAR Student is asked to name his/her STAR Teacher. Alex chose Ms. Kathy Floyd. Ms. Floyd taught Alex for 4 years, in the Gifted Program at Menlo School.

2. Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize students from Chattooga High School who made over a 25 on the ACT and over 1120 on the SAT. This is 70% or better on both tests, which is a huge accomplishment for these tests. Those students are:

- **3.** Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga High School FCCLA members who competed at State Leadership Conference in March.
 - -Hannah Thompson competed in the Focus on Children, senior category. Hannah placed 2nd at region and placed 4th at State, receiving Gold.
 - -Karsen Gilliam competed in the Illustrated Talk, senior category. Her project focus was on HPV prevention and community awareness. Karsen placed 1st at Region and placed 8th at State, receiving Silver.
 - -Blake Bonnano competed in the Interpersonal Communications, senior category. His project focus was on communication skills of those in marriages of 50 years or longer. Blake placed 1st at Region and 1st in State! He will be advancing to Nationals in June!

4. Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize one of Lyerly Elementary School's 5th grade students, Jayla Rich. Jayla was the county-wide Spelling Bee winner and went on to win the District Title. Jayla competed at the State Spelling Bee in Plains, Georgia on March 16th.

- **5.** Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Sawyer Mowry. Sawyer is a Kindergarten student at Leroy Massey Elementary. We recognized him last month as one of the county-wide winners for Young Georgia Authors. Since then, his submission, "Chattooga Wrestler," has won at the RESA level and will be forwarded to the State level for judging.
- 6. Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga High School Junior, Jorja Cooper. Jorja has been accepted into the Georgia Governor's Honors Program for this summer, in her area of Agriculture. Jorja competed against approximately 3,200 high-achieving students from across the state. There were around 800 spots available in the program. She will attend Berry College for 4 weeks this summer. This is a prestigious program! In order to be chosen, the student must be nominated by the school's Guidance Counselor. The student then has to complete an extensive application. If chosen as a finalist, as Jorja was, there is a 3-hour interview process in Atlanta. Congratulation, Jorja!
- 7. Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga High School Welding students. The Welding Fabrication Team recently placed 1st in Region and went on to win the State title! They will be competing in the Skills USA National Competition in Louisville, Kentucky in June. The Fab team is made up of CHS Seniors C.E. Massey, John Hunter and Tufton Blanks, and Freshman, Sage Owings. Also, CHS Senior, Chase Dotson won 1st place in the Georgia Sills USA Region competition and then went on to win the State competition as well. He will also be competing at Nationals in June. CHS Welding Instructor, Jeff Owings, said that he believes this to be the first time Georgia has ever had an Individual and a Fab Team to both win State at the same time.
- **8.** Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga High School HOSA student David Espy. David placed 1st in an "elevator" speech for HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America) during the HOSA Fall Leadership Conference in Atlanta, recently. The speech topic was "What is HOSA," and had to be delivered within 30 seconds. He was judged on his stage presence, diction voice, pronunciation, the impact of the message and organization of the message. David is the HOSA President for the 2017-18 school year.
- **9.** Board consideration of Superintendent's recommendation to recognize Chattooga's Future Problem Solvers. In March, seven teams and several individual competitors in grades 6-9 were selected to compete in the Future Problem Solvers State Bowl in Athens. This is an academic competition in which students must blend their critical thinking skills with creativity to develop solution ideas for a societal issue that is predicted to become a major challenge in the near future. Ultimately, students must develop a plan to solve the problem and convince others to support their idea during a presentation in front of hundreds of people.
