Dear Parents and Students:

Cheerleading is a very important part of Stockbridge High School. Holding this job is a responsibility. Being a Cheerleader is hard work, and requires constant dedication to self, squad/team, school, and the community.

Cheerleaders should ask themselves, "Why do I want to be a cheerleader?" Individuals should remember that in being a member of the cheerleading team and a representative of SHS, it is expected that he/she display a positive leadership image at all times. The most important element of high school is a student's academic progress. Therefore, cheer squad members/mascot are required to have a 2.5 cumulative GPA.

There is a <u>huge time commitment</u> involved in being a cheerleader. Some of the many commitments are: fund-raisers, camp, summer practices, and many hours during and after school. <u>Cheer commitment comes before other activities!</u> Candidates should understand that only illness and special family circumstances are legitimate reasons to miss a cheer activity. Because this has caused some conflict in the past, this standard is now being tightly maintained. Many times practices go longer than planned or the squad is asked to perform at an unscheduled event. This is why it is important to be able and willing to go the extra mile. <u>Cheer Squad members</u> are required to attend all scheduled practices, meetings and performances in their entirety.

A detailed schedule for the whole year is provided in the program guide. Make sure to check this for conflicts before you tryout.

Cheerleading can be expensive. The school doesn't help with any cost. Again, a detailed cost sheet is in the program guide. Fundraising opportunities will also be available. **Returning members must have a \$0.00 balance** on their cheer account to tryout.

Being a part of the cheerleading team can be some of the best memories and times of your life. Cheerleaders will get to know each other in such a way that it cannot be compared to that of any other team. We wish all of you the best at tryouts; enjoy the experience and GOOD LUCK TO YOU!

2021-2022 Cheer Squads



There will be 4 cheer squads for the 2021-2022 school year. Candidates will be able to state whether they want to try out for one or more squads on their application. *Because cheer teams function as one unit, it is essential that all members be present at all events. Please keep in mind SHS cheerleaders will be expected to participate in all of the sports listed within the squad. There will be NO exceptions. If you have a commitment that prevents you from cheering for one of the listed sports, you will not be able to cheer for that squad.

Varsity Football Spirit and Competition Squad (this functions as ONE team)

- Varsity is open to candidates of rising freshmen to seniors
- Candidates will be expected to cheer for both home and away spirit AND competitions, including play-off games
- Hup to 20 cheerleaders will be chosen for varsity; some will compete for competition, and some will serve as alternates for competition season and continue to cheer spirit
- Tumbling not required but highly recommended to make the varsity spirit/competition squad

Junior Varsity Football/Competition and Basketball Spirit

- Lunior varsity is open to candidates of rising freshmen to seniors
- 416 cheerleaders will be chosen.
- Cheerleaders will cheer at all football and basketball games; home and away.

Varsity Basketball Spirit Varsity is open to candidates of rising freshmen to seniors

- Candidates will be expected to cheer for both home and away spirit
- ♣ up to 20 cheerleaders will be chosen for varsity

NEW 9th Grade Football and Basketball Spirit

- Candidates will be expected to cheer for both home
- \clubsuit up to 10 cheerleaders will be chosen for the 9^{th} grade team

TRYOUT GUIDELINES

- Hair pulled back, we must see your face (pony tails)
- No gum, acrylic nails, or jewelry
- Candidates must have stomachs covered
- Comfortable lace up shoes should be worn at all times
- Wear dark bottoms and tryout t-shirt the day of the Tryout (April 29th)

A copy of 1st semester grades (GPA must be calculated)

TRYOUT CLINICS, PROCEDURES AND OBJECTIVES

- Candidates will go over: Stunting, Jumps, Cheer, Tumbling and a Dance.
- A panel of judges, as well as the cheer coaches, and those teaching the clinic are present at the tryouts.
- We are looking to select squad members that demonstrate strong skills in the following areas:

Being Coachable Running and Standing Tumbling Motion Technique Jumps Stunting
Dance Vocal Flexibility Attitude Spirit Energy / Enthusiasm

ELIGIBILITY

- Candidates must have all required documents signed by a parent/guardian in order to participate.
- All cheerleaders trying out must have a 2.5 GPA
- Candidates must be in good health and must work to maintain good health in order to cheer. If there are injuries that will keep the athletes for performing abilities, consider your tryout.

COMMITMENT

Participating in cheerleading is an exciting and fun experience. However, it requires a HUGE amount of time and commitment by all members, not only during the school year but the summer as well. As a member of the cheer squad you will be required to support the athletic teams at Stockbridge High School throughout the entire school year. This means in addition to practices you will be cheering 1 to 3 nights per week Cheerleaders do more than cheer at games; they help with assemblies, make gifts for teams and have other various responsibilities as they support the athletic teams at SHS. You will also be required to attend training camps and practices during the summer as well as all fundraisers. Any long term or recurring situations that are holding a cheerleader from these responsibilities may cause dismissal from the squad. If you are going to participate on the cheer squad it is important to know that SHS cheer comes first. Cheerleading is a team sport and we plan to stunt a lot. If there is just one person missing from practice it prevents the whole team from being able to stunt.

FINANCIAL COMMITMENT

**At this time we are unsure of the exact financial commitment. Timing of tryouts will impact uniform orders, camp involvement, fundraising and so on. All of these factors will impact the financial responsibility of team members. We do know that our cost will not exceed what is noted below. Once decisions are made and details are figured out, we will know more about the financial commitment for the 2021-2022 season and will updated before the new team parent meeting.

Please understand that being a part of the SHS cheer team will include a substantial financial commitment. You will be required to make four payments, during the first five months of our season (May-September). Late payments will result in restrictions in regards to cheerleader participation.

STOCKBRIDGE HIGH SCHOOL CHEERLEADING CONSITITION

Stockbridge High School (SHS) cheer team members should demonstrate high standards, good sportsmanship and promote the development of good character. All team members are expected to carry themselves in a manner which brings pride to SHS. Cheerleading is a privilege and it's important that cheerleaders and their parents be aware of the necessary rules, expectations and goals it takes to be a SHS Cheerleader.

- 1) **PURPOSE** The PRIMARY FUNCTION of the cheerleading squad is to support interscholastic athletics and to promote school spirit in a positive way. Throughout the year the cheerleaders support events in the following sports: Football games (JV/Varsity), girls' and boys' basketball etc. Cheerleaders will also be in charge of support during pep rallies, and other needed activities.
- 2) **ACADEMICS** A cheerleader's first responsibility is to his/her academics. Participating in cheerleading should not compromise the education process. All cheerleaders must maintain a 2.5 GPA with no more than one F's or N every semester. Failure to meet grades will result in dismissal from the team. Grades will be checked every progress to keep cheerleaders aware of their grades. There can be no F's or N's allowed or you will not be allowed to cheer but will be required to come to all practices and games to support the team.
- 3) **RESPECT** Cheerleaders will be expected to respect coaches and team members at all times. Team members are also required to respect all religions, races, disabilities and backgrounds. There will be no swearing, obscene gestures, and inappropriate behavior at any cheerleading activities. Cheerleaders will be required to follow all cheer accounts so their social media can be monitored. A high level of respect and class on all social media sites must be maintained at all times. Bullying (cyber or otherwise) is not allowed. Cheerleaders will be positive leaders, set good examples, display a positive attitude and work to develop a sense of pride at all times.
- 4) **EFFORT/TUMBLING/STUNTING** Cheerleaders will engage in cheering, dancing, tumbling, and stunting while on the squad. The SHS cheer squad adopts and executes a comprehensive safety program including conditioning and effective-spotting techniques at all times. All cheerleaders are expected to stunt. Tumbling skills performed at tryouts must be maintained throughout the year.
- 5) **COMPETITION** is secondary to promoting school activities and is made up of the Varsity team. Cheerleaders should strive for excellence in cheerleading, dance, tumbling, and stunting techniques. All cheerleaders involved will be expected to give 100% effort to become their personal best.
- 6) **WORK** We realize that some students must maintain employment to participate in this organization, but their first obligation must be to cheer. Practices, fundraisers and performances may not be missed because of work.
- 7) **OTHER COMMITMENTS** Coaches strongly encourage athletes not be a part of another sport/activity/team. Students desiring to participate in other SHS activities/groups must know that cheer practices are every day after school. During competition season, early morning or weekends practices may be required. Cheer practices are not allowed to be missed. The only exception to this rule is if your SHS event is a game. Missing practices, performances, fundraisers, etc. for outside SHS groups are not allowed.
- 8) **ABSENCES/TARDIES** All excused absences must be cleared with coaches. Excused absences consist of: extreme illness, death or funeral, weddings or school excused activity. If a cheerleader is sick and cannot attend to practices/games the cheerleader and their parents must inform coaches. If a cheerleader is well enough to be at school, they are well enough to be at practice and they will participate at the coach's discretion. Doctors' appointments need to be scheduled around practices and games. Unexcused absences: work, social events, parties, etc. Cheerleaders are to be on time to events, practices and games.

9)AUTOMATIC DISMISSAL The following is a list of things that will not be tolerated and will result in dismissal:

- The involvement in illegal/criminal activity (drugs, alcohol etc.)
- Cheating in school
- Sexual harassment, hazing and bullying
- 10) **TRANSPORATION** Cheerleaders are required to take the school bus when one is provided and can be released to their own parent only. Cheerleaders are not permitted to drive themselves. When buses are not provided, parents and coached will have to drive. Please sign the attached Driving Consent permission form for travel.
- 11) **PRACTICES/GAMES/ATTIRE** Practices will take place every day 3:45-6:00, and some Friday's before or after school when needed. All practices/games will be set on a monthly calendar and are mandatory. Cheerleaders represent Stockbridge High School and will be done with class. Cheerleaders must come to practices with hair up, lace up shoes on and no jewelry or long nails. All clothing must cover stomachs and behinds. Game attire (hair and bows) will be determined on the monthly calendars. No bra straps should be seen when wearing your cheer uniform. Socks must be white ankle socks and assigned spankies.
- 12) **INJURY** When a cheerleader is injured and is ascertaining by a coach and trainer unable to perform, the cheerleader must obtain a doctors release to return to activities. Cheerleaders must attend all practices and games while injured unless arrangements have been made with coaches. Cheerleaders may or may not be put back into performances or routines once cleared.

13)APPERANCE

Hair must be worn off the shoulders and away from the face at all times. Only soft hairbands may be used - No hard barrettes. Bobby pins may be used during practice but must be securely fastened. Cheerleaders will be required to wear hear in a "high ponytail" on top of the head at all events. Please keep this in mind when getting hair done. Members of the <u>Varsity team</u> are not allow to wear braids of any sort. Hair color must be natural shades of brown, autumn or red (No blue, green, bright red, bright blond or orange). There will be no exceptions. Nails must be kept trimmed and filed to a length no longer than the fingertips. NO false nails allowed at practice or events. Fingernail polish is prohibited at events. No glitter is to be worn on face, body, hair or uniform at any time.
