Class of 2017 Graduation Requirements

- ▶ **4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)**
- ▶ **4 Credits Mathematics**
One must be Algebra I and one must be Geometry
- ▶ **3 Credits Science**
One of which must be Biology I
- ▶ **3 Credits Social Studies**
1 credit in World History , 1 credit in U.S. History , .5 credit in U.S. Government .5 credit in Economics
- ▶ **1 Credit in a Performing or Practical Fine Art**
- ▶ **1 Credit of HOPE**
- ▶ **8 Elective Credits**
- ▶ **1 Online Course**
- ▶ Students must earn a 2.0 grade

Grade Forgiveness

- ▶ Students may earn forgiveness for classes where they earned a D or an F by taking a virtual school class
 - ▶ PLATO – a computer program used to retake a class where you earned failing grades. Classes are taken here at Creekside during the school day.
 - ▶ You can take a class for grade forgiveness online over the summer but be aware it may take longer than you think!

Dual Enrollment Offerings

Dual Enrollment Criteria

- Teacher recommendation
 - Meet the county criteria to take an honors/AP/DE level course
 - 3.0 or higher **UNWEIGHTED GPA**, must meet this by May 26, 2016
 - Qualifying test score on either the ACT, SAT or CPT exam, must meet this by April 22, 2016
- Test Score requirements

SAT	440 - Critical Reading	450 - Math
ACT	19 - Reading	21 - Math
CPT	83 – Reading Comprehension and Sentence Skills	85 – Elementary Algebra and Arithmetic Skills

Do you need to take the CPT?

- Creekside will administer the CPT exam on January 28th and February 11th
- Only test 150 students – 75 each day
- Must turn in a DE application by January 14th to guidance in order to sit for CPT exam on January 28th or by January 29th to sit for the February 11th CPT exam
- Must turn in official copy of SAT or ACT scores with application no later than April 22th, 2016 if you want to take DE classes for the 2016-2017 school year
- Can register for DE courses at your registration appointment if you meet all criteria and have turned in paperwork
- If you are currently enrolled in DE courses, you do not need to complete another application – but need official scores for DE Math

Summer 2016 Dual Enrollment at SJRSC

- Must meet all qualifying criteria by February 5th (Must take the January CPT)
- Must notify Ms. Fornera no later than Friday, February 12th, 2016
- Must have an official test score from SAT, ACT, or CPT and a completed DE application
- Summer registration will take place the week of February 22nd

Fall 2016 Dual Enrollment at SJRSC

- Must meet all qualifying criteria by May 1st
 - Rising seniors can go part-time or full time at the college per semester
 - To go full –time (early admissions), students must have at least a 3.5 or higher **UNWEIGHTED** GPA and meet all other qualifying criteria (Test scores, etc.)
- Must notify Ms. Fornera no later than Friday, May 1st, 2016
- Must have an official test score from SAT, ACT, or CPT and a completed DE application
- Fall registration will take place during the summer on a specific date – student will be notified before the school year ends of their appointment day and time

DE vs. AP

Earning College Credit; which path is right for you?

Dual Enrollment

- College credit is awarded with completion of class with a grade of C or better
- DE courses are indicator of success at the college level because students have been tested in real college environments. Students in DE classes are treated as college students with high level of responsibility placed on them
- All state colleges and universities in Florida accept SJRSC DE Credits. Colleges and Universities in other states are very likely to accept them as well
- Admissions counselors smile upon successful completion of Dual Enrollment classes. However, earning a grade of C or lower could negatively impact admissions
- Class grade (GPA) transfer with you to college
- One DE courses equals 3 college credits hours
- Private colleges and universities are free to establish their own transfer criteria therefore it is best to check in advance pertaining to the schools DE policy

Advanced Placement

- College credit is awarded with a 3 or higher on the AP exam; high school credit is awarded by class grade
- AP tests are a demonstration of proficiency and competency in subject matter based on class grade and score on AP test. A high score on the AP exam signifies that you are a good student who can handle college level work
- All state colleges and universities in Florida accept AP credits. Colleges and Universities in other states are very likely to accept them as well
- Admissions counselors smile upon successful completion of AP classes. A grade of a C in an AP class is not considered negative when applying to college
- Class grade (GPA) will not transfer with you to college
- A high score on the AP exam could earn multiple college credits depending on exam and score
- Private colleges and universities are free to establish their own transfer criteria therefore it is best to check in advance pertaining to the schools AP policy

FCTC Dual Enrollment

First Coast Technical College provides students with the opportunity to take technical classes (electives) while taking required academic courses at their home high school. Students work towards earning a **career certificate**.

- ▶ Be 16 years old by August 10, 2016
- ▶ Good attendance and discipline record
- ▶ 2.0 GPA
- ▶ On Track for graduation
