District Overview

Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) is fully accredited by the AdvancED/SACS-CASI organization. Made up of 66 schools and centers with a population of more than 55,000 students, the school system is the county's second-largest employer with nearly 6,800 employees. Established with a district-wide theme of Committed to High Performance, CCPS is providing boundless opportunities for its students to be prepared to live and succeed in a global economy through an innovative, technology-based, STEM & STEAM approach to education.

The school district is located just 17 miles for Downtown Atlanta and Clayton County houses the world's busiest airport - Hartsfield-Jackson International Atlanta Airport. CCPS offers a variety of learning options such as traditional schools, fine arts magnet schools and/or programs, Career, Technical, and Agricultural (CTAE) Pathways, online courses, and Gifted Education Programs. The school district also provides state-of-theart facilities for community and district growth including the Clayton County Public Schools Performing Arts Center and the S. Truett Cathy Professional Learning Center.


SPLOST Update

A public vote or special election to consider a SPLOST renewal (SPLOST VI) will take place on March 19, 2019.

Clayton County Public Schools Commitment to High Performance

- Establishment of Superintendent Advisory Groups and expansion of Critical Conversation Community Meetings to engage stakeholders
 and create a culture of open dialogue and transparency while strengthening relations between the school district and community
- Establishment of Clayton County Public Schools Foundation Incorporated
- Reduced number of teacher vacancies to ensure students receive consistent instruction/rigor
- With the performance of Martin Luther King Elementary on the 2018 College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI), there were
 no Clayton County Public School campuses on the 2018 Governor's list of Turnaround Eligible Schools.
- Stilwell School of the Arts and Elite Scholars Academy (ESA) earn selections to Top Schools in Georgia Rankings established by U.S. News and World Reports. ESA & Stilwell ranked 33rd and 36th respectively.
- In 2017 CCRPI Data indicated that 42 of 60 eligible Clayton County Schools Beat the Odds by surpassing their predicted CCRPI Scores.
 This is an increase of 9 schools from the previous year and translates to 70 percent of campuses earning this distinction.
- The 2018 CCRPI reports that seven (7) CCPS schools outperformed Georgia statewide score of 76.6. Schools outperforming the state were Arnold Elementary (83.7), Elite Scholars Academy Middle (98), Elite Scholars Academy High (94), Lake City Elementary (83.9), Smith Elementary (82.9), M.E. Stilwell School of the Arts (82.9), Unidos Dual Language Elementary (84.2). The district-wide score was reported at 65.1. An updated calculation for the 2018 CCRPI made comparisons with prior years not possible or valid.
- Clayton County had only one school on the initial Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) schools list. Perry Career Academy
 (PCA) Jonesboro, an alternative instructional solution campus, made the list under the Low Graduation Rate category.
- Implementation of "Extending Learning Beyond the Classroom" program. The program will provide 38,000 students with laptops by the 2021-22 school year. This is contingent upon continued Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) funding.
- Creation of SUMMERT.I.M.E. STEM Summer Camps for students in grades K-11. Also, enhanced district's STEM approach to implement a STEMulating Culture of High Performance by infusing the STEM mindset into all content/subject areas in all grade levels
- Board of Education approved the creation of four dual language immersion programs to be implemented over the next three years at Mt.
 Zion Primary/Elementary and Kilpatrick Elementary (Spanish, 2018), Lake Ridge Elementary (French, 2019) and River's Edge
 Elementary (Chinese, 2020).
- Expansion of School Choice, Advanced Placement Classes and CTAE Programs at various schools and increased number of students in Advanced Placement courses and participation in Dual Enrollment Programs as well as Purchased additional reading and math online tools (i-Ready, Achieve3000, and Odysseyware) to eliminate students' reading and math skill deficits and improve outcomes
- Arnold Elementary, Suder Elementary and Elite Scholars have been granted full eligibility to join the Cambridge Assessment International Education organization as well as Lee Street Elementary have been awarded International Baccalaureate Program candidacy. Jonesboro Middle and Jonesboro High are currently seeking candidacy to join the International Baccalaureate Program. CCPS has implemented Firefighter and EMT pathways at Drew and Mundy's Mill High Schools as well as a political leadership at Jonesboro High.
- Riverdale High School partnered with Devry University's Advantage Academy for Network Administration. This partnership allows selected students to earn an Associate of Science degree in Network Systems Administration while simultaneously enrolled in their junior and senior years of high school.
- Brown Elementary is the first elementary school in CCPS to earn the AdvancED STEM Certification which is valid for five years.
- Creation of See Something Say Something Anonymous Tip Line for students and employees; available through CCPS Mobile app free for Android and Apple devices
- Successful openings of new Elite Scholars Academy (October 2017), Riverdale Gymnasium (November 2017), and East Clayton (August 2018). Construction/Renovation of M.D. Roberts Middle to create Kay R. Pace Elementary School of the Arts (scheduled to open January 2019). Planning and process initiated for rebuilding Jonesboro High and renovating Riverdale High as well as purchased land for College and Career Academy and building new schools using SPLOST V and future SPLOST VI pending BOE and voter Approval
- Elevation of Perry Career Academy to school status. Perry Academy offers an innovative approach through a non-traditional delivery of
 instruction that allows students to earn required credits to graduate on time, career and/or college ready. Nearly 300 students
 successfully exited the program in 2017-18.
- Seven district schools were named by State Schools Superintendent Richard Woods as Advanced Placement Honor Schools for 2018.
- All traditional CCPS high schools are eligible to award International Skill Diploma Seals (ISDS). ISDS's are awarded to students who complete the international education curriculum and engage in extracurricular activities and experiences that foster the achievement of global competencies. In addition, all CCPS high schools are eligible to award the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) Fine Arts Diploma Seal. Awarded to graduating high school seniors, this diploma signifies students who have completed a Georgia Fine Arts Pathway, Creative Industry Skill Focus Course, Community Arts Partnerships, Written Reflection, and a Fine Arts Portfolio. Clayton County Public Schools had 150 students graduate with this distinction as part of the Class of 2018.
- Increased professional development programs and the creation of district-wide and school-based mentoring programs. Professional
 development programs focused on developing staff in areas of content, pedagogy, and leadership capacity with the district beginning to
 address the areas of social-emotional learning (SEL) and mental health or wellness training for staff
- Expanded robust number of prominent business/corporate, community, collegiate, faith-based and governmental partnerships to strengthen partners in education support to the school district
