The Historical Association started with a group of ten local citizens who got together with the desire to protect, promote, and interpret local history. They organized the Historical Association, purchased the abandoned old Mercantile building in Clayton (which was built in 1889), added it to the Natioal Register of historical Places, and began to restoration of the Museum. They completed the restoration and opened the Mercantile as a museum for all to enjoy in 2008.

- Age requirement: High School Seniors or College Freshman are eligible to apply for this scholarship (determined on January 1 of the year the scholarship is given out)
- Applicant can only win scholarship once.
- Applicant must have attended school at Challis High School
- If chosen, the applicant must provide proof of college enrollment (at least 12 credits (full time)) prior to receiving the scholarship check.
- Applicant will be judged on:
 - o Financial need (40%)
 - o Leadership, personal, community and civic activities (30%)
 - Essay (750 words or less) on question provided each year by the Clayton Historical Association Board of Directors (20%). This year's question is:
