<u>Art Club</u> is sponsored by Jennifer Turlington, RMS art teacher. This club meets monthly here at RMS. The purpose is to explore art theory and apply advanced art techniques. There is a small fee for supplies.

<u>Academic Bowl</u> is sponsored by Jay Lambert and Michael Turlington, RMS teachers. This club meets regularly to prepare for a variety of academic bowl competitions across the state of Georgia. This group competes on Saturdays throughout the school year.

<u>Builder's Club</u> – This group is the youth club associated with the Kiwanis Club. Students in grades 6 - 8 may participate. Students meet after school once a month to plan philanthropy activities for the school and to hear month community speakers. The sponsor of this club is Dana Hunley.

<u>Hiking Club</u> – This club is a family-oriented club that meets one Saturday a month to explore interesting local sites. Odyssey of the Mind - OotM is an international academic competition that provides imaginative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college. Team members apply their creativity to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics, to devising powerful structures of balsa wood. They then bring their solutions (in the form of an 8 minute skit) to competition on the local, state, and world level. Most of the Yearbook meetings are held during the student's connection class or in the morning. Students participating in Yearbook are expected to attend after school activities for the purpose of taking pictures. Yearbook club is open to 8th graders only. <u>Chorus</u> – This activity is a group of 6-8 grade students who meet on a regular basis before, during, and after school. Students participating in Chorus commit to performing at after school events and our annual fine arts night. Additionally, this group has 2 concerts during the school year – one in the December and one in May. The choral director is Miriam Reynolds.

<u>Band</u> – This activity is a group of 6-8 grade students who meet on a regular basis before, during, and after school. Students participating in Band commit to performing at after school events and our annual fine arts night. Additionally, this group has 2 concerts during the school year – one in the December and one in May. The band director is Matt Koperniak.

<u>Math Club</u> – The purpose of this club is to prepare for various math competitions. This club meets two times a month. The sponsor of this club is Terri Cline.

<u>Junior Beta Club</u> - Junior Beta Club is a part of the National Beta Club. The club promotes the ideals of character, service, leadership, and good citizenship among 7th and 8th graders at Riverwatch Middle School. Membership is made up of 7th and 8th graders who meet the requirements of all A's in all classes during the previous school year. After qualifying students must complete an essay and receive two teacher recommendations.
