690	<b>Internal Service Fund</b>  A proprietary fund type used to account for the operation of organizational units within the LUA and to LUA functions which provide goods or services to other LUAs, or to other governmental units on a cost-reimbursable basis. Examples may be central warehousing and purchasing, central data processing, and central printing and duplication operations.	
693	<b>Enterprise Fund</b>  A proprietary fund type used to account for operations which are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises. The costs (expenses including depreciation and indirect costs) of providing goods or services to the students or general public on a continuing basis are financed or recovered primarily through user charges. Enterprise funds also are used to account for operations where the school board or state regulatory agency has decided that periodic determination of revenues earned, expenses incurred and net income if appropriate for capital maintenance, public policy, management control, accountability or other purposes. Examples might include a bookstore operation, an athletic stadium operation, a community swimming pool operation, or after school child care operation.

Trust funds would include non-expendable trust funds, expendable trust funds, and pension trust funds. Fiduciary funds may include funds for a parent-teacher organization or a teacher organization. The long-term liabilities include general obligation bonds, capitalized lease obligations, installment sales agreements, legal judgments, special assessments payable to cities or other governmental units, unfunded pension liabilities, and notes and warrants which are not due within one year.	
902	<b>Pension Activity - Districtwide</b> Fund to be used to account for the pension activity for GASB 68 reporting requirements.

0112	<b>Unamortized Premiums on Investments</b> The excess of the amount paid for securities over the face value that has not yet been amortized. Use of this account is restricted to short-term money market investments	
0113	<b>Unamortized Discounts on Investments (Credit)</b> The of the face value of securities over the amount paid for them that has not yet been written off. Use of the account is restricted to short-term investments	
0114	<b>INTEREST RECEIVABLE</b> The amount of interest receivable on investments.	
0121	<b>Taxes Receivable</b> The amount of taxes collected and anticipated to be collected within 60 days by the tax collecting agency, but not remitted to the LUA.	
0131	<b>Interfund Loans Receivable</b> Amounts that are due, other than charges for goods and services rendered, from another fund in the LUA and that are due within one year.	
0132	<b>Interfund Accounts Receivable</b> Amounts due from another fund. The offsetting transaction is an entry to Interfund Accounts Payable (Account 0402) in the appropriate fund.	
0133	<b>Advance To Other Funds</b> Amounts that are owed, other than charges for goods and services rendered, to a particular fund by another fund in the LUA and that are not due within one year.	
0141	<b>Intergovernmental Accounts Receivable - State</b> Amounts due from another state governmental unit.	
0142	<b>Intergovernmental Accounts Receivable - Federal</b> Amounts due from another federal governmental unit.
