 - Family support at home




- Review assignment and assessment grades as a family


WAYS FOR FAMILIES TO BE INVOLVED

- Allocate funds for student and school improvement from State SAC funds




What is Title 1?

SOCIAL MEDIA AND CELL PHONES

SAFETY FIRST!

Steps to take to avoid physical confrontations

- Report to teacher/bus driver that there is an issue immediately
- Report to discipline assistant/counselor to request a peer mediation
- If on social media, screen shot, block, do not respond, report.

Options available for support

- Conversation from Discipline Assistant/Administration
- Peer Mediation
- Notification to staff to increase supervision
- Alternate passing/location assignment
- No Contact Agreement
- Hope Scholarship and Bully/Harassment Report.

Consequences for Fighting

- 4th/5th:
- 2F Fighting (1st offense) 3 days OSS
- 2F Fighting (2nd offense) 5 days OSS
- 2F Fighting (3rd offense) 10 days OSS and referral for Tier III review

• 6th/7th/8th:

- 2F Fighting (1st offense) 5 days OSS
- 2F Fighting (2nd offense) 10 days
 OSS, possible Disciplinary Reassignment
 Request
- 2F Fighting (3rd offense) Disciplinary Reassignment Request
- 3PHA-Physical Attack-10 days OSS and Disciplinary Reassignment Request



- Middle school students are required to successfully complete three years of language arts, math, science, social studies which must include Civics and a career component (with a grade of D or higher), in order to be promoted to grade 9. [F.S. 1003.4156].
 - Monitor grades weekly
 - Use homeroom intervention time and reteach/reassess opportunities
 - APEX class recovery assigned by teachers
 - APEX promotion recovery in place of electives if fail for quarter/semester

 Middle school students that score a level 1 on ELA FSA will be placed in Intensive Reading, per state statute.
