## CONTINUATION CRITERIA FOR SLS 1101/1301

- ✓ Completed application verification page turned into main guidance desk by April 1 of 9<sup>th</sup> grade year
- ✓ Completed collegiate high school performance contract turned into main guidance desk by April 1 of 9<sup>th</sup> grade year
- ✓ A copy of the student's math, reading and writing/English test scores turned into main guidance desk by April 1 of 9<sup>th</sup> grade year\*
- ✓ Attend one of the collegiate high school orientation sessions during summer on the St. Augustine Campus of St. Johns River State College
- ✓ Maintain a 3.0 or above Unweighted, Cumulative High School GPA

\* Students are not required to have a specific “qualifying score” yet, they just need to submit proof that they have taken all three subjects

# 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

- Fall Term (at BTHS) – 3 college credits
  - SLS 1101
- Spring Term (at BTHS) – 3 college credits
  - SLS 1301
- Summer Term (at SJRSC)
  - NONE

## CONTINUATION CRITERIA FOR ALL COURSES BEYOND SLS 1101/1301

- 3.0 Unweighted, Cumulative High School GPA
- 2.0 College GPA
- College Ready Scores in Reading and English (or Writing) on file with BTHS and SJRSC by February 1 of 10<sup>th</sup> grade year
- College Ready Scores in Math on file with BTHS and SJRSC by February 1 of 11<sup>th</sup> grade year

- Fall Term (at BTHS) – 6 college credits

- Spring Term (at BTHS) – 6 college credits

- Summer Term (at SJRSC) – 9 college credits
  - Mathematics General Ed
  - Communications General Ed
  - Prerequisites/Elective Credit

# 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

- Fall Term
- 17 college credits (all courses at SJRSC)
  - ECO 2013 Macroeconomics or ECO 2023 Microeconomics
  - ECO 1931 Financial Literacy (Financial Literacy MUST be taken at the same time as Economics)
  - Science General Ed
  - HUM 2020 Introduction to Humanities
  - Mathematics General Ed
  - Prerequisites/Elective Credits
- Spring Term
- 16 college credits (all courses at SJRSC)
  - POS 1041 U.S. Federal Government
  - Science General Ed
  - Humanities General Ed

- Student is responsible for sending score report to SJRSC and BTHS
- BTHS must have qualifying reading and English (or writing) scores by February 1 of 10<sup>th</sup> grade year; qualifying math scores by February 1 of 11<sup>th</sup> grade year\*

- Student is responsible for sending score report to SJRSC and BTHS
- BTHS must have qualifying reading and English (or writing) scores by February 1 of 10<sup>th</sup> grade year; qualifying math scores by February 1 of 11<sup>th</sup> grade year\*

## PERT TESTING INFORMATION

- Students should contact SJRSC testing office to schedule testing session
- \$20 fee
- Allot at least 4 hours for testing
- Students must bring photo ID
- Allowed 3 attempts in a 12 month period
- Must wait 48 hours between testing attempts
- BTHS must have qualifying reading and English (or writing) scores by February 1 of 10<sup>th</sup> grade year; qualifying math scores by February 1 of 11<sup>th</sup> grade year\*

# AA DEGREE ADVISEMENT

- High School Counselors cannot advise for AA degree requirements
- SJRSC Academic Advisors cannot advise for High School diploma requirements
  
- Make sure students stay in touch with their high school counselor regarding courses they are taking to meet high school diploma requirements
- Make sure students stay in touch with their SJRSC academic advisor regarding courses they are taking to meet AA degree requirements
  - SJRSC Academic Advising Department - 904-808-7402
  - Students should make an appointment with their SJRSC Academic Advisor in January of their 11<sup>th</sup> grade year

## KEY POINTS FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Dual enrollment is the start of a student's college transcript. The grades students earn in dual enrollment will follow you forever.
- Please be aware of student's college GPA. Take dual enrollment courses seriously. These grades can affect your college admissions, Bright Futures, and financial aid eligibility.
- **Students that earn a grade below "C" or withdraw from a course will be removed from the collegiate high school program.**
- If a student's high school unweighted GPA drops below 3.0, they will be removed from the collegiate high school program.
- If a student does not meet the testing requirements by the deadlines, they will be removed from the collegiate high school program.

# COLLEGE STUDENT 101

- STUDENTS are responsible for
  - Contacting the SJRSC advisor, testing department, registering for tests, and filing out and turning in any dual enrollment forms by the posted Bartram Trail High School deadline.
  - Sharing information with parent(s).
  - Make sure professors know your name & face by introducing yourself after the first class.
  - Every course has a published syllabus. Find it. Print it. Follow it.
  - Pay attention to the Professors' Office Policies or contact methods.
  - Attend every class, be early for class, & stay until the professor dismisses the class – EVERY CLASS – regardless of the attendance policy.
  - Pay attention to the SJRSC calendar as it differs from the BTHS calendar.
  - Bring your textbook(s), notebook, and something to write with to every class.
  - Take notes in your notebook (not your phone) every class.
