Course Description and Objectives

This course is a thematic study of British literature and will include a variety of genres and significant themes. The purpose of this course is to allow the student an opportunity to acquire:

- Read closely to analyze and evaluate all forms of (i.e. complex literary and informational) texts.
- Construct task-appropriate writing for diverse purposes and audiences.
- Design and implement concise and sustained research tasks focused by questions and understandings of rigorous and relevant topics.
- Collaborate and communicate effectively in a range of discussions, responding appropriately to diverse perspectives.
- Communicate information, reasoning, and supporting evidence that conveys a clear and distinct perspective.
- Employ the components of language (including conventions and word choice) effectively in written or spoken form.
- Exposure to significant British literature through various genres.

Course Textbooks

Elements of Literature, Sixth Course: Literature of Britain and Elements of Writing, Sixth Course HMH Into Literature: British Literature (2 books-\$11.10 each)

Students will also read a variety of novels, plays, short stories, and poems throughout the course.

**Note: Failure to return books that are assigned or checked out for student use will result in a recovery fee not to exceed the purchase price of the text.

Grading Policy

- Tests/Essays/Projects: 40% of course average
- Classwork/Homework/Quizzes: 40% of course average
- Final: 20% of course grade each semester
- **Note this year Henry County Schools is on semester grading and Eagle's Landing High School is following a block schedule. Each semester a student can earn 1 whole credit.

Remote Learning Attendance Policy

Google Forms will be utilized to take attendance for both synchronous and asynchronous work periods. Students need to check either the Google Meets chat or the Google classroom announcements to find the Google Form for attendance. Entries from the Google Form will be recorded in Infinite Campus.

Make-Up Work

It is the student's responsibility to retrieve make-up work from the teacher or Google Classroom in the event of an excused absence. Homework and daily work need to be completed within 2 days of the student's return. Tests must be made up within a week for credit. Any assignments received prior to the excused absence are due immediately upon the student's return.

Late Work

Assignments that are submitted late will be graded and entered after on-time work has been graded and entered. Students must complete missing work by the end of the unit.

Students will receive a zero (0) for missing assignments. Students will be "ZAPPED" for missing assignments through our Zeros Aren't Permitted Program (ZAPP).

Homework Policy

- All homework shall be assigned in order to provide practice opportunities for skill attainment and mastery.
- Students are expected to spend time after school reviewing course material and doing independent reading in order to attain the skills necessary for future assessments.
- All assignments must be neatly done and reflect time and effort.
- Occasionally, homework may be assigned that falls under another grading category such as take home tests, quizzes, and/or projects. When this is the case, students will be informed prior to submission of the assignment.

*Note: Homework assignments are assigned at the teacher's discretion and usage of such assignments may change without prior notification. Please note that all assignments are for the benefit of the student and may not necessarily require grading but may be necessary for the completion and/or comprehension of future graded tasks.

Academic Honesty and Plagiarism

Per the Student Handbook Academic Honesty: Coursework submitted by a student must be the student's own, and original work. Students shall not cheat on any assignment by giving or receiving unauthorized assistance, or commit the act of plagiarism. Students who commit such acts are subject to receiving a grade of zero (0) on the assignment as well as disciplinary action.

- All borrowed information presented in written assignments must be documented using MLA style.

• All papers and large written projects will be submitted electronically through Google Classroom.

Technology
