Export – a product sent to another country and sold Import – a product brought into one country from another Free maker economy – the people, not the government, decide what will be produced Free enterprise – the economic system in which people may start any business that they believe will succeed Debtor – a person who owes money

Charter – a document giving permission to a person or group to do something Invest – to put money into something to try to earn more money Stock – piece of ownership in a company Cash Crop – crop that people grow to sell and earn money Indentured Servant – someone who agreed to work for a number of years in exchange for the cost of a voyage to North America

New England Colonies Vocab

Pilgrim – A person who makes a journey for religious reasons Compact – an agreement Growing Season – time of year when it is warm enough for plants to grow Town Meeting – gathering where colonists held elections and voted on the laws Dissenter – a person who does not agree with the beliefs of their leaders

Middle Colonies Vocab

Proprietor – person who owned and controlled all the land in a colony Representative – someone who is chosen to speak and act for others Treaty – An official agreement between nations or groups Artisan – a person who is skilled at making something by hand Laborer – a person who does hard physical work Apprentice – someone who studies with a master to learn a skill or business

Southern Colonies Vocab

Plantation – large farm in which crops are raised by workers who live on the farms Legislature – group of people with the power to make and change laws Refuge – a safe place Indigo – plant that can be made into a dark blue dye Overseer – person who watches and directs the work of others
